The 444th Stated Meeting of the Presbytery of Santa Barbara, Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) was convened on March 7, 2015 at 9:40 am at First Presbyterian Church, Lompoc, California by Moderator Mickey Stueck who opened in prayer. A quorum was present. Mickey invited Ron Urzua to tell the presbytery about the potential merger of Word of Life and Westminster. Mickey invited Andy Rock to tell the presbytery about the Grover Beach Church reaching out to the disabled community.

Report of: Presbytery Council

Since the last meeting of Presbytery the Council has taken the following actions:

Received the resignation of Bonnie Boe as director of the Lay Leader Training program.

Began considering proposed changes to the Presbytery Standing Rule which will be brought to Presbytery at the May 16 meeting for a first reading.

Considered the budget for the remainder of 2015. Property and Finance presented a recommendation for a budget for the remainder of 2015 reflecting a cut of at least \$118,000 from the personnel budget with the decisions to be made by Personnel. This is based on a projection of \$245,000 from ministry share, no spending of reserves, and no reduction in the mission budget. The Council decided to come to the Presbytery with two options -- the Property and Finance proposal; the other is a "soft landing" using PRT money.

Approved both Highlands and Mission Street to begin the process of chartering.

Received a letter from the Session of El Montecito Presbyterian Church requesting the beginning of the discernment process and named a Presbytery Response Team as indicated in our Gracious Dismissal guidelines.

The next Presbytery Council meeting is scheduled for 4/29/15 at 10:00am.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

December 13, 2014 Presbytery Minutes were approved with the consent agenda.

REPORT OF EXECUTIVE PRESBYTER

Rev. Jan Armstrong spoke about Front Porch and Mission Street Church. He reported that the Presbytery has been named in a law suit along with Carpinteria Community Church and that all questions should be directed to Mike Wesner or Sean Cowdry. He reported that Paso Robles and Mission Street Church have plans to charter this year. IMPACT has partnered with San Fernando Presbytery. And he invited the pastor's to attend the February 2016 pastor's retreat with Los Ranchos Presbytery in Malibu. The presbytery will begin a mission study and Jan encouraged those interested in being involved to contact the presbytery office.

REPORT OF STATED CLERK

David Wilkinson reported about the possible merger of Word of Life Presbyterian Church and Westminster Presbyterian Church.

It was MSC to form an Administrative Commission to pursue merger.

The stated clerk announced the task force, who have been working with the two congregations will form the Administrative Commission. They are Tom Stephen, Chair, Mickey Stueck, Dan Stevens and Jonathan LaBarge ex-officio (San Fernando Presbytery).

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION PC(USA)

The Proposed Amendments approved by the 221st General Assembly (2014) were distributed by e-mail to all minister members and clerks of session in January 2015.

In addition, the Proposed Amendments were posted on the presbytery's website.

It was moved, seconded and carried to adopt the "Guidelines for Debate and Vote" including the General Assembly document "Seeking to be Faithful Together" which were included in the materials for this meeting. (Attachment 5)

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the negative to Amendment 14-1, by counted vote 19 YES, 35 NO.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-A, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-B1, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-B2, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-C, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-D, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the affirmative to Amendment 14-E, by voice vote.

IT WAS VOTED to respond in the negative to Amendment 14-B1, by counted vote 19 YES, 38 NO.

WORSHIP began at 11:20 am with Eugenia Gamble preaching.

2015 Budget

Ted Brandt lead discussion about the proposed 2015 budget referring to the Letter to Presbytery from Council March 2015 (Attachment 6) and PSB Budget March 2015 Option numbers (Attachment 7)

It was moved and seconded to adopt the 2015 budget as recommended by Council (Column F).

It was moved and seconded to substitute a motion to adopt the 2015 budget column G.

It was MSC to table both motions for 20 minutes to allow discussion.

After discussion, it was MSC to extend the agenda discussion 15 minutes.

It was moved to amend the main motion to adopt the 2015 budget as recommended by Council (Column F) to begin April 1, 2015, with the Adopted 3 month budget to be used through March 31, 2015, and to spend the remaining 2015 Presbytery meetings on defining the direction of the Presbytery and role of the EP. Motion dies for lack of a second.

It was MSC to extend the agenda discussion 60 minutes by standing vote 25 YES, 15 No.

It was MSC to end debate on perfecting the main motion.

The main motion was deemed perfect by voice vote.

Discussion then ensued on perfecting the substitute motion.

It was MSC to end debate on perfecting the substitute motion.

The substitute motion was deemed perfect by voice vote.

Debate began on the two motions.

The perfected substitute motion did not become the main motion by a counted ballot vote 17 YES, 26 NO.

The perfected main motion was adopted by a counted ballot vote 27 Yes, 14 No.

ADJOURNMENT With prayer by the moderator at 3:37. The next stated meeting is on Saturday, May 16, 2015 at Emmanuel, Thousand Oaks.
