According to Evyub Yunus, President, Student Association for Interfaith Dialogue, “This award honors an individual whose efforts are focused on increasing knowledge about diverse faith, race, ethnicity and cultural traditions in extended communities by utilizing educational activities, seeding public conversations focusing on important social issues and promoting interaction and dialogue across diverse groups.” Mr. Yunus continues, “Rather than concentrating on differences, this student association tries to focus and emphasize commonalities that bring us together as those far outnumber the differences.”
