

The Presbytery of Southern Kansas convened at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, June 9, 2009, at First Presbyterian Church, Newton, KS, by Moderator, Rev. Angela Madden. The meeting opened with a Call to Gather, Hymn, Prayer and Words of Welcome from Rev. James Anderson.

From the workshop on Governance was the overall understanding that the document will be smaller. Even though this will be user friendly, Presbyteries will need to develop manuals in which councils will operate.

From the Missional workshop there was a spirit of enthusiasm for the future of the church and new ways to be the church.

The Presbytery Task Force determined to send the written responses in complete form to the General Assembly. The General Assembly has now agreed to take responses from individual churches if received by the June 30th deadline.

A motion prevailed that the Task Force be dismissed with thanks.

General Presbyter Report

A demonstration of the PSK website, now under construction, was given.

Don Owens summarized the recent events concerning Covenant Presbyterian Insurance Program and those PSK churches insured by this provider. Don Owens requested that Jon Prange, representative for Covenant Presbyterian Insurance Program (CPIP), be given the privilege of the floor to address the Presbytery. Mr. Prange discussed the purchase of CPIP by United Church of Christ Insurance Board (UCCIB). He assured those churches formerly covered by CPIP that there would be no interruption in coverage. He gave a brief history of UCCIB and reminded churches that they would be receiving loss reduction and risk assessment materials as well as coverage details. Don Owens recommended church currently served by CPIP remain with UCCIB and he pledged to examine other insurance companies and to make a recommendation based on his research.

Moderator Elect, Kay Hull, served as Moderator for the remainder of the meeting.

Camping Committee Report

Camping attendance is up this year. The 3rd and 4th Grade camp set a new attendance record (114) for 3rd and 4th grade camps in the history of Westminster Woods. During this camp, 34 campers accepted Jesus Christ. The Westminster Woods Chapel was overflowing. Chapel fund raising continues!

Skip Johnson, pastor Northminster Presbyterian Church, Hutchinson, and member of the PC(USA) PDA Response Team thanked the churches of PSK for their One Great Hour of Sharing offering. Through the PSK 2008 OGHS offering, \$40,654.84 was raised. Skip reminded the assembly that there is a need for bilingual volunteers to work with the PC(USA) PDA team. He also reported that in addition to himself, Don Owens, Nora and Ken Coryell, Pam and Gary Evans, Jim Pitts and Ernie Hull attended the SYNOD sponsored PDA training. These participants, along with Dave Grisham, have met to design a PSK Disaster Plan. This plan will be submitted to Council for approval during their next scheduled meeting. The plan will be placed on a flash drive and distributed to each PSK church. The PSK Disaster Response Team will be visiting each church to help the church write its own Disaster Recovery Plan.

Budget and Finance Report

Ken Coryell reviewed the income and expenses of PSK. New this year, as part of the Records Review process, each church will be asked to list information concerning any outstanding loans.
