

The Presbytery of Southern Kansas convened at 9:00 a.m. on Tuesday, November 11, 2008, at First Presbyterian Church Hutchinson by Moderator, Rev. Rob Erickson.

The meeting opened with worship led by Rev. Tim Soule and Rev. Amy Dame, First Presbyterian Church Hutchinson and Rev. Paul Nixon, Epicenter, Washington, DC.

Installation of Moderator-Elect, Rev. Angela Madden, Presbyterian Church Pratt, was conducted by Moderator, Rev. Rob Erickson.

Guest Speaker

Paul Nixon, author of *I Refuse to Lead a Dying Church* spoke to the assembly on the history of church development/decline and the six choices that a church must make to keep from dying:

- Life over death
- Community over isolation
- Fun over Drudgery
- Bold over mild
- Frontier over Fortress
- Now over later

He reminded those present that in order to move forward, a church must identify those key players in the life of the church and engage their talents in the mission of growing the local church. Those key players being:

- Pastor
- Choir director/music leader
- Matriarch/patriarch
- The youngest active adult leader
- The spiritual Yoda
- Person closest to the money
- The bright-eyed people

Committee on Ministry

A motion prevailed to temporarily suspend Article XIII.1 of the Administrative Manual.

Karen Raines, Moderator, reviewed the actions taken on behalf of the Presbytery:

- C. Approved the renewal of the contract between The Reverend Bob Wyman and Presbyterian Church of Belle Plaine.
- D. Approved the renewal of the contract between The Reverends Arlene and Jesse Patrick and Community Presbyterian Church in Chase.
- A. Approved the changes to Terms of Call for clergy members of Presbytery of Southern Kansas for 2008.
- F. Approved the CIF for Presbyterian Church of Garden City.

A motion prevailed to grant a waiver from compliance to G-14.0202 regarding the limit of terms served on the board and total consecutive years as Elder on Session for Presbyterian Church of Arlington and Calvary Presbyterian Church of Wichita.

A motion prevailed to accept the Terms of Dissolution between The Reverend Irving Simon and First Presbyterian Church of Halstead as a result of the resignation of Reverend Simon. Terms are as follows:

1. Salary Three months for a total of \$6500.
2. Manse Remain in the manse until November 2 with an additional allowance of \$1950 to be paid in three monthly payments.
3. Vacation Payment of \$3250 for accrued vacation which will be paid by October 15.
4. Pension Dues will be paid on all severance payments

Scott Solether, Whitewater Valley Presbytery, Indianapolis, Indiana was introduced. He presented his statement of faith and answered questions from the Book of Order.

Stated Clerk's Report

A motion prevailed to approve the minutes from the August 26, 2008 Presbytery meeting.

The June 9, 2009 Presbytery meeting will be held at the First Presbyterian Church, Newton.

A motion prevailed to include the report from the Committee on Representation in the November Presbytery minutes.

The Committee on Representation is mandated by the *Book of Order* to serve the Presbytery as an advocate for racial ethnic members, women, different age groups and people with disabilities. The committee is also to serve as a resource and consultant on representation concerns. Several representation concerns were highlighted in the committee report of 2006; minutes pg. 41. Those concerns have been addressed and the statistics for representation on presbytery committees indicates compliance.

Committee representation for 2007: 180 persons serve presbytery committees and 83 people presently serving those committees represent women, racial ethnic groups, different age groups and persons with disabilities.

The committee has determined that there is fair and effective representation among the persons elected to serve committees of Presbytery.

Veterans Day recognition, song and prayer were offered by The Reverend Rob Erickson, Moderator.

Council

Sue Nispel reported that the five year performance review of the General Presbyter had been completed. The PSK Personnel Committee members had met with Don Owens. The assessment was a satisfactory review based on the information obtained in a survey completed by each Council member and submitted to William Mulford, Moderator PSK Personnel Committee.

The First Presbyterian Church of Conway Springs has requested funds to repair the front entryway of the building due to deterioration from water damage. They estimate the cost of repair to be \$21,000.00. **A motion prevailed** that the Presbytery provide a grant of \$5,000 from the Small Church Fund to the First Presbyterian Church of Conway Springs and that the Presbytery also make a loan to Conway Springs, from the Small Church Fund, in the amount of \$10,000 to be paid back at 3% interest over three years.

Sue Nispel presented the PSK Board of Trustees Report.

A motion prevailed to approve the sale of a house located at 1104 First Street (Legal description: Lot 5, Block 3, Shinn's addition to the city of Dodge City, Kansas) owned by the First Presbyterian Church of Dodge City. The Session has set a minimum selling price of \$40,000.

A motion prevailed to approve the sale ¼ section of farm land in Kiowa County (Legal description is SE4 less RD r/W Sec-13, Twp-31, Rng-19) owned by the First Presbyterian Church of Coldwater. The estimated value of this property is approximately \$400 per acre. Funds from the sale will be used for continuing operations at the church.

A motion prevailed to provide First Presbyterian Church of Viola with a \$5,000 grant from the Small Church Fund in order to complete demolition of the old, vacant church building in Viola. The estimated cost for demolition is \$16,000 and the church currently has \$10,000 for this purpose.

Treasurer's Report

John Goss presented the financial statement for the Presbytery as of September 30, 2008. He presented a review of the Financial Condition/General Fund; Statement of Activities; Statement of Reserve Funds

Budget and Finance

Ken Coryell presented the review of the Budget and Finance Committee.

Old business from August 26, 2008 postponed to November 11, 2008 Presbytery.

The exiting policy concerning per capita reads, "That the Presbytery will forward appropriate per capita allocations for any church that votes to withhold their apportioned per capita after the financial records are closed for the year if the balance of the General Mission fund remains above \$0 at closure."

The motion before the body reads: “It is the intention of the Presbytery to forward appropriate per capita allocations for any church that does not pay their per capita after the financial records are closed for the year. However, the Presbytery will maintain a Cash Operating Balance of \$60,000. If paying the remaining per capita would bring the Cash Operating Balance below \$60,000, the Presbytery will pay toward per capita the funds available above the required \$60,000 balance.”

Discussion on the motion ensued. An amendment to the motion was presented and seconded. The amendment reads: “As a matter of policy, Presbytery will not have excess funds available for churches that choose to withhold their per capita.”

Discussion on the amendment ensued.

A motion prevailed to suspend discussion on the amendment. **Motion to amend was defeated.**

A motion prevailed that the PSK operating policy concerning per capita is, “It is the intention of the Presbytery to forward appropriate per capita allocations for any church that does not pay their per capita after the financial records are closed for the year. However, the Presbytery will maintain a Cash Operating Balance of \$60,000. If paying the remaining per capita would bring the Cash Operating Balance below \$60,000, the Presbytery will pay toward per capita the funds available above the required \$60,000 balance.”

General Presbyter’s Report

Don Owens presented Rob Erickson, Moderator, with a plaque recognizing the Presbytery’s contributions on behalf of the Wichita Area Presbyterian Churches Habitat for Humanity Build. Churches involved in the build were also recognized.

The PSK Resource Library is now online at www.pbysk@sbcglobal.net and resources are ready for distribution. The procedure for online check out was reviewed.

Stewardship and Mission Interpretation

Mary Knecht announced that the discussion on 2009 PSK Shared Mission had been presented to 54 of the 66 PSK churches.

Mary reminded the audience that the Presbyterian Stewardship Conference “Stewardship Kaleidoscope” would be occurring March 9-11, 2009 at the Hilton Hotel, Kansas City International Airport, Kansas City, MO. Further information concerning the conference may be found by visiting www.heartlandpby.org/kaleidoscope.

As an update on PSK’s partnership with the Presbyteries of Northern Mexico, Mary announced that a formal signing of the partnership will take place during the Presbytery of Southern Kansas meeting held January 31, 2009.

Jay Ayers discussed his recent travels, with Dave Grisham, to attend the Presbytery of Chihuahua Meeting in Mexico. The presbytery is the size of Texas plus New Mexico. Participants travel long distances to attend. The presbytery meets twice a year for two days. The days begin with an early breakfast and usually end at approximately 9:30 p.m. On second day of their visit, the Presbytery meeting did not end until 1:30 a.m. of the following day. An invitation has been extended from the Presbytery of Chihuahua for representatives of PSK to attend their partnership signing ceremony to be held April 16-17, 2009. Church members of PSK have been invited to come to Navojoa, Sonora, Mexico on February 8-10, 2009, to assist church members in Mexico in their community evangelism efforts.

Community Outreach Committee

Diane Monger reported that \$25,340.00 from the Harper Parish Funds had been distributed to mission projects of churches with 100 members or less.

Requests for information for the PSK Mission Yearbook of Prayer have been sent to each church. Please return your church information to Jan Lane at the Presbytery office by November 17th so the book may be distributed by the first of 2009.

Diane reminded those present that for 2009 \$800 have been budgeted for scholarships. These funds are available to further your Christian and Education life.

Congregational Ministries

Jeanette Marks thanked Don and Annette Owens for all their work on the PSK Resource Library and she encouraged everyone to use the resources available.

Bill O’Connell discussed the “Leadership Advancement Forum ‘09” to be held January 10th at Grace Presbyterian Church, Wichita; January 17th at First Presbyterian Church, Coffeyville; and January 24th at Presbyterian Church of Garden City. Each session will be from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. Two tracks will be offered during this time. One track will be for new Elders and Deacons and the second will be held for those that want to learn more. Discussion on the General Assembly Amendments will take place at each of these locations.

Jay Ayers discussed the Pastors and Church Educators Seminar being held January 12-16, 2009 at Cross Winds Conference Center, Hesston. All churches will receive e mails and a mailing about this event.

Camping Committee

Jeremiah Lange reviewed the Camping Committee report. He reported that the funds raised to date for construction of the new Westminster Woods Chapel is \$190,000.00. He showed a new brochure that has been printed for the chapel fund raising project.

A motion prevailed to authorize Kenton Cox to serve as architect for the chapel project.
