**A motion prevailed** to approve the Presbytery minutes of August 27, 2010.

**A motioned prevailed** to temporarily suspend the Manual of Operations 2.3 and 8.9b allowing the officers and moderators of PSK committees, except the Moderator of Presbytery (*Book of Order, G-9.0202b; mandated term limits*), to remain in office through 2011.

An Investigating Committee has been appointed.

To help facilitate entering the 2010 statistical information, the Presbytery's website [www.pbysk.org](http://www.pbysk.org), has a link to <http://ogasys2.pcusa.org> where church statistical reporting maybe completed. The church is to use their assigned login ID and password. The church's ID and password are being distributed. Also available on the Presbytery's website is an informational manual to help in this process, "Instructions for Completing the On-Line Session Annual Statistical Report." All statistical information must be entered by Wednesday, Feb 16, 2011.

A 2011 schedule that will allow voting on nFOG, the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution, and the Confession of Belhar in order to meet the General Assembly's deadline of May 31, 2011, has been established by the Church Order Committee.

The vote on the New Form of Government will take place during the Presbytery meeting on February 15, 2011. nFOG is available as a pdf file through [www.pcusa.org](http://www.pcusa.org). Also hard copies are available (one copy for each church) containing materials for congregational study, adult education classes and presbytery discussion. One hard copy for each congregation is being made available at the November 16, 2010 PSK meeting.

The vote on the Proposed Amendments to the Constitution will take place during the Presbytery meeting on April 12, 2011. There are nine different proposed amendments: 5 to the Form of Government, 1 to the Directory for Worship, 3 to the Rules of Discipline. These are also available for study by congregation through [www.pcusa.org](http://www.pcusa.org). If the changes to the current Form of Government (Book of Order) are ratified by the presbyteries, these amendments will also amend the nFOG as far as possible. Additional materials and one hard copy of the Proposed Amendments per church will be made available at the February meeting of PSK.

The vote on the Confession of Belhar will take place during the Presbytery meeting on June 21, 2011. Information and a copy of this Confession, as adopted, is available through [www.pcusa.org](http://www.pcusa.org). It is complete with background and study guide. One hard copy, complete with background and a study guide will be made available for each congregation at the February meeting of PSK. Each session is encouraged to plan time for study and discussion of the Confession of Belhar.

All proposed amendments to the Book of Order require an affirmative vote of a majority of the presbyteries to be adopted. Amending the Book of Confession requires both a 2/3 vote of the presbyteries as well as confirmation by the 220<sup>th</sup> General Assembly (2012), allowing PSK to meet deadline of July 9, 2011.

**A motion prevailed** to accept the Separation Agreement for Don Owens, General Presbyter:  
SEPARATION AGREEMENT  
FOR  
GENERAL PRESBYTER

Recognizing the Presbytery of Southern Kansas does not have a model separation agreement for those in executive service and that no previous agreement is on file for those previously leaving this office; and recognizing no standard agreement has been developed for others serving in similar positions across the church, the following guidelines are presented:

1. Participate in the life of a ministry setting from which I have retired only as directed by the Presbytery (Standards of Ethical Conduct II.15.)
2. Consult with the Committee On Ministry in Presbytery of residence regarding my involvement in any ministry setting during my retirement (Standards of Ethical Conduct II.17.)
3. Following one year and approval of the COM and the person serving as General Presbyter, consideration will be given to allow the resumption of activity as Minister of Word and Sacrament in those places deemed appropriate by COM and with the understanding that there will be no involvement in areas that would interfere with the duties of the General Presbyter or their successors.
4. All requests for preaching or other service to the churches of the Presbytery must be approved by the Committee On Ministry with the concurrence of the General Presbyter.
5. All contacts with Council, the committees of the Presbytery, staff, and churches in transition will cease on November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2010 unless specifically requested by COM and the Council.
6. All personal items will be removed from the office of the General Presbyter on or before November 30<sup>th</sup>, 2010.
7. Acknowledge the date of retirement will be set for November 30, 2010.

**A motion prevailed** that Don Owens is Honorably Retired effective November 30, 2010.

Budget and Finance reports were presented by Dan Bonine, Moderator. He presented the Balance Sheet and the Statement of Activities through 9/30.10.

**A motion prevailed to set the 2011 Per Capita total at \$30.00.**

General Assembly \$6.50; Synod of Mid America \$2.72; Presbytery \$20.78.

**A motion prevailed** to approve the proposed PSK budget for 2011. The budget is based \$30.00 per capita for 2011. (See budget as Appendix A)

### **Synod of Mid America**

David Grisham, Synod of Mid-America Commissioner, spoke to the changes occurring with the Synod. The Synod of Mid-America is becoming a “virtual/mobile” synod. The working of the synod will remain the same, but a central location will no longer be maintained.

**A motion prevailed** that the Synod shall be composed of commissioners who shall be all the active minister members of presbyteries within the boundaries of the Synod and those elders who are commissioners to presbyteries from the churches within their bounds at the time of convening of Synod Assembly or who have membership in their Presbytery by virtue of elected office to Presbytery. Each commissioner’s term shall run from the convening of a Synod Annual Assembly to the convening of the next. Commissioners may serve an indefinite number of terms. Each presbytery shall designate these commissioners to the annual meeting of the Synod, having previously established parity for participation and representation within the bounds of the presbytery.

**A motion prevailed** to elect the present Commissioners to serve through June 30, 2011. New Bylaws and Standing Rules for the virtual governance model of the Synod of Mid-America will take effect July 1, 2011.

- The date for the PSK mission trip to Mexico has been set for May 27<sup>th</sup> –June 4, 2011.
- Peacemaking offering funds were used to help finance the trip of Skip Johnson and David Grisham to Haiti to build solar energy systems which can provide power for clean water systems, communication systems, refrigeration and other need that will improve the living conditions in Haiti.
- It was announced that Brotherhood food ministries has an immediate need for food for their pantry.
- The 2011 mission trips of the college students from Sterling College were noted.
