

# Expansion Update

Over two years ago, our parish began looking at our expansion needs and how we could best meet those needs. A dedicated area for our High School Youth Ministry was high on the list. Our Sunday Religious Education classes are now serving over 800 children and have outgrown the available classroom space. The school desired to add an additional class of kindergarten, first, and second grades to better accommodate growing enrollment, yet still maintain ideal class sizes. Lastly, our Prince of Peace Middle School had outgrown their space.

Today, we have two major contracts underway. The first is to enclose Black Creek, which flows through our property, to grade approximately eight acres for new playfields, to construct a new entrance from Preserve Parkway and also add additional parking space. The work began last August and is expected to be completed in April 2015. The cost will be slightly under \$1.1 million.

The second contract is for the construction of a 16,000 square foot, two-story classroom and youth center building on the former school playgrounds. The building will house all of the middle school facilities. A large youth room and an office will be on the first floor and open into an outdoor courtyard that connects to the existing school building. The new building will also house a media center that will be available to both school and church groups, classroom space, restrooms and an elevator. Construction on the building began in mid-November and should be completed by June in time for the 2015-2016 school year.

Renovations to the existing building include relocating the front office to the existing science room and building a new entrance. This new entrance will improve visitor access and building security. Other space changes will also occur to better accommodate our students, faculty and administration. The cost for the new building and existing school renovations is projected at about \$2.6 million. Architect and engineering fees will bring the grand total of both projects to just over \$4.1 million.



## Prayer



For example, the choir is learning many special pieces of music for the February mission with Fr. Jim Marchionda as well as new Easter and Confirmation music. The Prayer/Liturgy Committee meets quarterly and is in contact with each other via email and weekly commitment contact in order to bring a prayerful experience to each day at Prince of Peace.

## Formation

*“Give and gifts will be given to you; a good measure, packed together, shaken down, and overflowing, will be poured into your lap. For the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you.” -- Luke 6:38 --*

The formation of each individual becomes part of the formation of the parish community. As members of the Body of Christ, a stewardship parish recognizes that it has a call from God to give - to move from selfishness to selflessness. This formation is a life-long journey of conversion for both the individual and the parish. It involves education of the mind and conversion of the heart. Ongoing Catholic education (for children and adults) is important if we are to grow in our lives as stewards.

Faith Formation is offered in many ways at Prince of Peace. Currently there are 830 children enrolled in Religious Education classes. Sacramental preparation includes 165 children preparing to receive First Eucharist and 107 for Confirmation. This school year we initiated parent/children retreats for First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and Confirmation. Approximately 100 kids are involved with our Middle School and High School Youth Groups. Twenty-six adults are attending RCIA classes, and Baptismal Prep classes are now offered twice a month to accommodate our growing parish. Marriage Prep classes are held once a quarter averaging 10-12 couples in attendance.

Adult formation includes more than just RCIA. Sunday morning classes, from 9:45 - 10:45 am, include such topics as Bible study, Church history and theological perspectives. The six Sundays of Lent will feature a special Confirmation prep series for adults who have never been confirmed in the faith and others who seek a deeper understanding of Catholic beliefs and practices. Wednesday evening Bible study classes are also offered.

The annual Prince of Peace Mission planned for the first week of February will feature Fr. Jim Marchionda, noted Dominican preacher and composer. The theme “Family, Friends, and God” will address contemporary issues faced by Catholics in today’s complex world.

## Prince of Peace School



Prince of Peace Catholic School has been a ministry of our church for fifteen years. Our faith-centered school offers a challenging academic program that engages all students in the interdisciplinary lessons of STREAM. The STREAM pedagogy incorporates the elements of science, technology, religion, engineering, arts and math. Teaching across and within these disciplines collaboratively develops critical thinking skills and prepares students for real-world and project-based learning experiences throughout their lives.

Since 2007, Prince of Peace teachers have been praised for their ability to keep the school at the top of the ranks both in student achievement (top 25% of the nation) and through national recognition. We are a Blue Ribbon Lighthouse award-winning school.

As the campus and our student body grow (approximately 450 students), administrators fine-tune the teacher-student ratios to ensure that we retain an intimate environment that provides a world class education. Our efforts have yielded success as evidenced by the many PoP graduates who are excelling in high school IB and AP programs as well as at prestigious universities throughout the country. They are leaders in their schools and community as well. We light the candles, they light the world.

The Hospitality Pillar continues to look for new and innovative ways to ensure Prince of Peace is a welcoming parish offering hospitality to all parishioners as well as our community. # Service

The Service Pillar's mission is to put our faith into action through supporting and engaging those within our parish and in the greater local community. It is through this pillar that we hope to provide a hands-on experience of living Christianity and bring faith, hope and love to others. In being an instrument of the Holy Spirit we intend to inspire Prince of Peace parishioners to participate in one of the ministries or days of service throughout the year.

In 2014, we served in many ways through our many ministries. Our Lenten day of service took place at multiple locations. At Catholic Social Services we built shelves and organized donated food and clothing. At the Church of the Reconciler, volunteers wove beds for the homeless from plastic bags. Still others visited with residents at the Oaks skilled nursing center. Just a couple weekends ago, 165 parishioners created 200 "no-sew" blankets in Deasy Hall to warm CSS clients.

The garden ministry helped to construct, plant and dedicate the Our Lady of Guadalupe garden at CSS. Our shared blessings ministry outfitted 75 families with household items and the caring needles group made 500 shawls and lap blankets that went to hospitals and parishioners. Breast cancer survivor ministry provided Easter baskets and a Christmas party to Our Lady of Fatima Kindergarten students. In the fall, we held a back-to-school fair in Deasy Hall attended by hundreds from the Birmingham Hispanic community. A tamale sale followed a month later that benefitted CSS.

As stewards in service, we stand ready to minister to the varied needs of our parish family and greater community.
