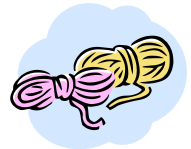
Caring Needles

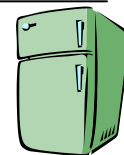

Lethal Injection Under Fire

St. Louis - A bungled execution in Oklahoma provides death penalty opponents with a fresh, startling example of how lethal injections can go wrong. But the odds of successfully challenging the nation's main form of capital punishment will probably hinge on exactly what caused the inmate's apparent agony.

If four-time convicted felon, Clayton Lockett, suffered because of a collapsed vein or improperly inserted IV, the legal landscape might not change much. If the execution drugs or the secrecy surround them played a role, defense attorneys for other prisoners could have powerful new evidence to press the U.S. Supreme Court to get involved, legal experts say.

Thirty-two states have the death penalty, and all of them rely at least in part on lethal injection.

The White House stopped short of suggesting a moratorium. Legislatures and governors could also order investigations or a temporary halt to executions. Jerry Cox, president of the National Association of Criminal Defense Lawyers, said the botched Oklahoma execution should "shock the conscience of all Americans," even those who previously supported the death penalty. "Most of the world and virtually all democracies have abandoned the death penalty," Cox said. "This is just horrific."

In light of other apparently bungled executions around the U.S. in recent years, Jen Moreno, staff attorney at the Berkeley School of Law Death Penalty Clinic, said the risks are clear. "To say that they're isolated incidents is mischaracterizing them, and what they really are is foreseeable consequences of using an inherently dangerous procedure," she said. (Jim Salter. z.
