Devotional Series

The Catholic Church dedicates the month of December to the Devotion of the Immaculate Conception. The Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of Mary, the patronal feast of the United States and a Holy Day of Obligation, represents God's saving grace at work, in recognition of Mary's complete submission to His Will. We also celebrate the Marian Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe this month.

This brief prayer, known as an aspiration, is most famous for its presence on the Miraculous Medal, one of the most popular Catholic sacramentals. "Conceived without sin" is a reference to Mary's Immaculate Conception. **"O Mary, conceived without sin, pray for us who have recourse to thee."**

The Holy Father's Intentions for December are:

General Intention: The migrants throughout the world may be welcomed with generosity and authentic love, especially by Christian communities.

Missionary Intention: Christ, light for all humanity. That Christ may reveal himself to all humanity with the light that shines forth from Bethlehem and is reflected in the face of his Church.

Are We Christian Stewards?

Reflection on U.S. Bishop's Pastoral Letter on Stewardship

Through Baptism, God offers each of us a Christian vocation, the path to a new way of life. He calls us individually and, as with his other gifts, he expects us to be good stewards of our vocation. He may call us as clergy, religious, lay person, married or single and intends each one of us to play a unique role in carrying out the divine plan. Our challenge is to understand and accept our vocation and to respond generously to the opportunities and challenges it entails.

Stewards of God's gifts are not passive beneficiaries. God requires us to be active participants with him in our own redemption and to be his evangelists in helping bring others to redemption. We are obliged to collaborate and cooperate in continuing the redemptive work of Jesus, which is the Church's central mission. Our task is to proclaim and teach, serve and sanctify as stewards of the Church.

As parents, we are called to nurture our children in the light of faith. As parishioners, we should each do our part to make our parish a true community of faith and a vibrant source of service to the larger community. As members of the universal Church, we assume a responsibility to give generously of our time, prayers, money, and personal service according to our circumstances. 
