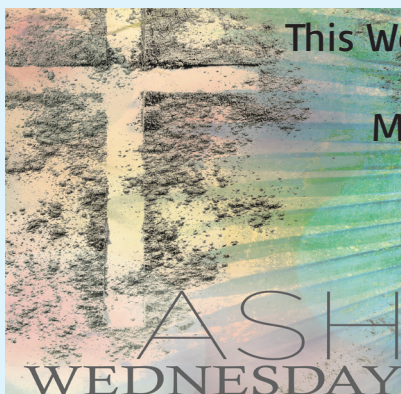
PASTOR'S CORNER

I hate my purse...

In one essay, Nora Ephron writes about why she hated carrying a purse -- and why it took her a long time to finally start using one.

"...here's what happens with a purse. You start small. You start pledging yourself to neatness. You start vowing this "This Time It Will Be Different." You start with the things you absolutely need - your wallet and a few cosmetics that you have actually put into a brand-new shiny cosmetics bag, the kind used by your friends who are competent enough to manage more than one purse at a time. But within seconds, your purse has accumulated the debris of a lifetime. The cosmetics have somehow fallen out of the shiny cosmetics bag (Ok, you forgot to zip it up), the coins have fallen from the wallet (Ok, you forgot to fasten the coin compartment), the credit cards are somewhere in the abyss (Ok, you forgot to put the Visa card back into your wallet after you bought the sunblock that is now oozing into the lining because you forgot to put the top back onto it after you applied it to your hands while driving 70 miles an hour down the highway)...There's half a bottle of water, along with several snacks you saved from an airplane trip just in case you ever found yourself starving and unaccountable craving a piece of cheese that tastes like plastic. Perhaps you can fit your sneakers into your purse. Yes, by God, you can! Before you know it, your purse weighs 20 pounds and you are in grave danger of getting bursitis and needing an operation just from carrying it around. Everything you own is in your purse. You could flee the Cossacks within your purse. But when you open it up, you can't find a thing in it - your purse is just a big dark hole full of stuff that you spend hours fishing around for. A flashlight would help, but if you were to put one into your purse, you'd never find it."

Don't get too cheeky, guys: you have your brief cases, gym bags, and car trunks. All of our overstuffed bags and basements and attics and closets are exactly what Jesus is warning about in today's Gospel: filling our life with so many things, fearing that we will be without what we need. But life is not about acquiring things but experiencing God's grace in compassion and peace. What we should fear being without is the assurance that we are loved and the realization that our lives have purpose. Jesus does not deny the reality of basic human needs for food and clothing, but to dispute the holiness of God with the perishables of wealth and power is the ultimate human tragedy. 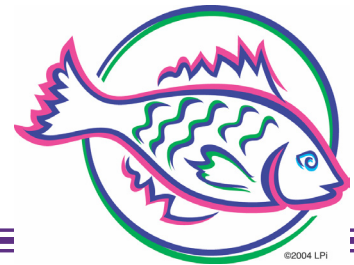

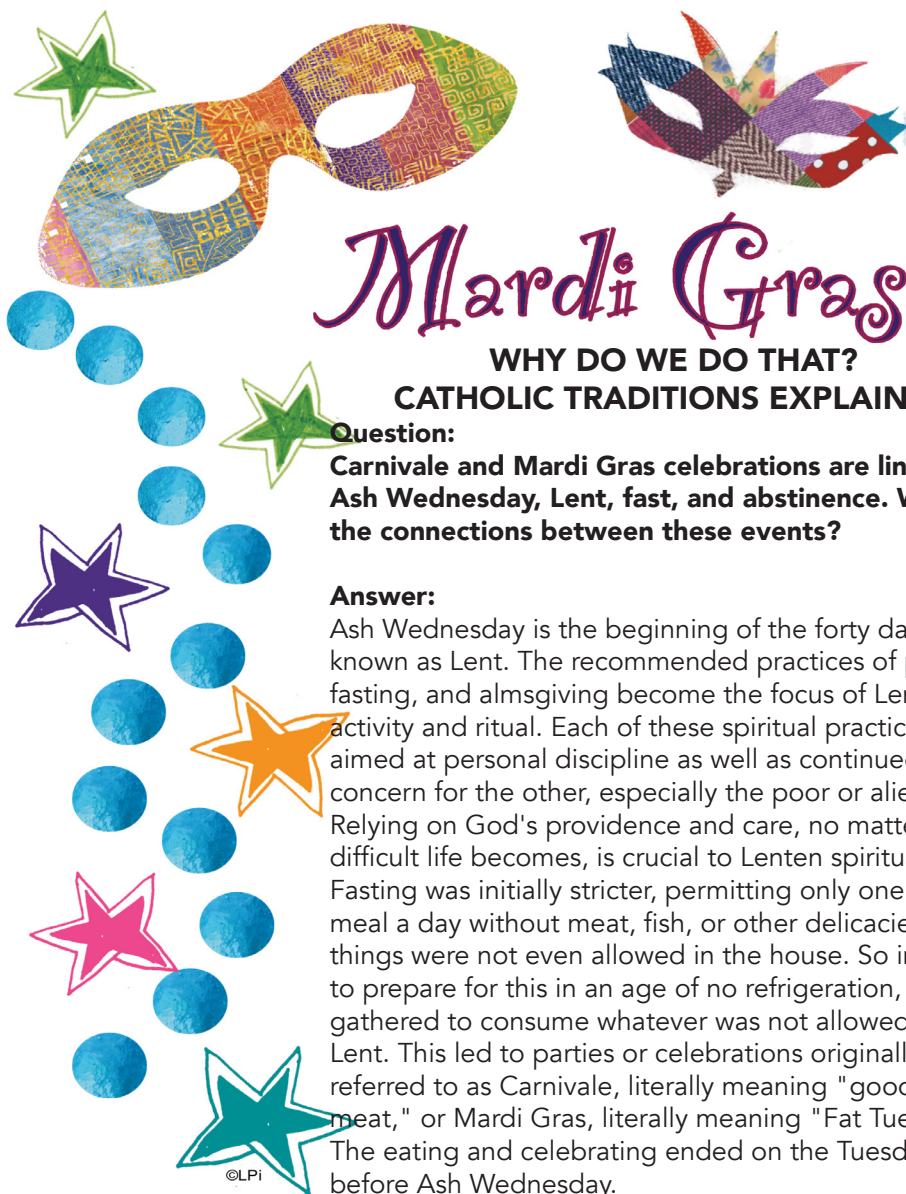


Stewardship: Parishioners Answering God's Call in Hospitality

Mardi Gras

WHY DO WE DO THAT? CATHOLIC TRADITIONS EXPLAINED

Question:

Carnivale and Mardi Gras celebrations are linked to Ash Wednesday, Lent, fast, and abstinence. What are the connections between these events?

Answer:

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the forty days known as Lent. The recommended practices of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving become the focus of Lenten activity and ritual. Each of these spiritual practices is aimed at personal discipline as well as continued concern for the other, especially the poor or alienated. Relying on God's providence and care, no matter how difficult life becomes, is crucial to Lenten spirituality. Fasting was initially stricter, permitting only one simple meal a day without meat, fish, or other delicacies. Such things were not even allowed in the house. So in order to prepare for this in an age of no refrigeration, people gathered to consume whatever was not allowed during Lent. This led to parties or celebrations originally referred to as Carnivale, literally meaning "goodbye to meat," or Mardi Gras, literally meaning "Fat Tuesday." The eating and celebrating ended on the Tuesday just before Ash Wednesday.

LENT

We begin Lent this week on Ash Wednesday. As we ponder what to "give up" for Lent perhaps we should include making an extra effort to respond to the Gospel passages from the Sermon on the Mount that we heard over the past 5 weeks.

Here is an example:

"You have heard that it was said; you shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." (Mt 5: 43-48)

Begin Lent by reading Matthew chapters 5, 6, and 7 for the complete Sermon on the Mount and many more examples of how we are urged to be perfect like our heavenly Father.

“Ustedes, pues, sean perfectos, como su Padre celestial es perfecto” (Mt 5, 48). Consiente Ud. o no, a todos nos gusta la perfección. Muy raras son las personas que no les importa el verse bien y el quedar bien con los demás. Pero, con referencia a las palabras de Jesús sobre la perfección parece que nos pide imposibles. Podemos entender su esperanza al comprender un poco el significado de la palabra. Jesús nos reta a responder a los otros sin límite. Para ampliar nuestro conocimiento aún más sobre la palabra “perfectos” veamos que nos dice el Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica en el número 41: “Todas las criaturas poseen una cierta semejanza con Dios, muy especialmente el hombre creado a imagen y semejanza de Dios. Las múltiples perfecciones de las criaturas (su verdad, su bondad, su belleza) reflejan, por tanto, la perfección infinita de Dios”.

¿Qué concepto tienes tú de la perfección? ¿Significa lo mismo para ti la perfección humana que la divina? La invitación es ver con lo profundo del corazón lo que es justo e injusto, el amor y el odio y luego lanzarnos a actuar sin límite por lo perfecto, por lo bueno, por lo mejor para todos. Al participar cantando en la asamblea hoy, pidamos la santidad de Dios, que es rico en compasión, misericordia y perdón. Jesús espera que seamos perfectos, él sabe que somos limitados y que fallamos. Pero ánimo, no debemos de dejar de intentar ser buenos. “Al que te pide, dale; y al que quiere que les prestes, no le vuelvas la espalda” (Mt 5, 42). ¡Más claro no se puede ver!

Los cuatro pilares de la iglesia

¿Que significa la iglesia es “una?”

Jesús sólo inicio una iglesia. Cuando hablamos de la unidad de la iglesia estamos hablando de la unidad del pueblo de Dios. A menudo no referimos a la Iglesia como el cuerpo de Cristo. Pablo habla de esto perfectamente en I Corintios 12. Habla sobre cómo todos hemos recibido diferentes dones, pero estos dones nos son dados, no para nuestro propio beneficio sino para el bien común. Y habla de cómo todos somos parte de un cuerpo, pero cada parte del cuerpo desempeña un papel único y vital.
