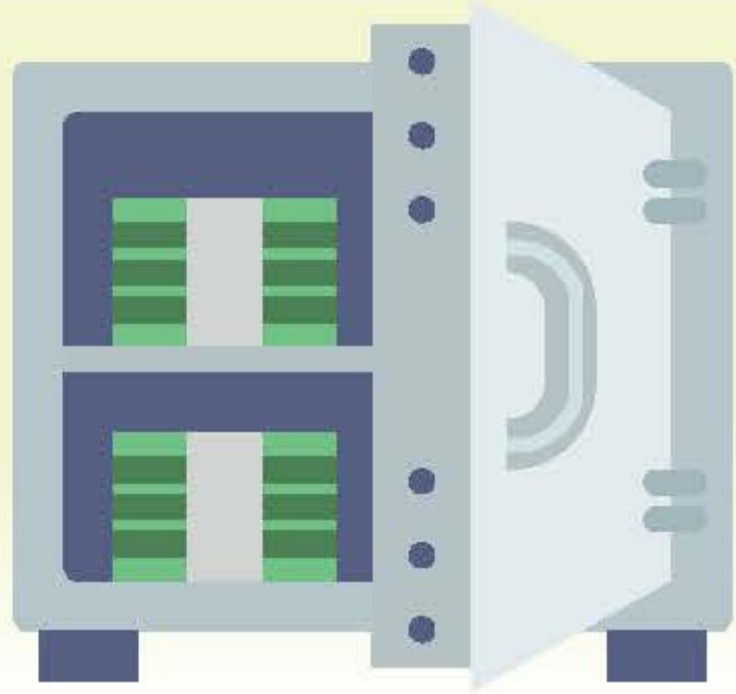

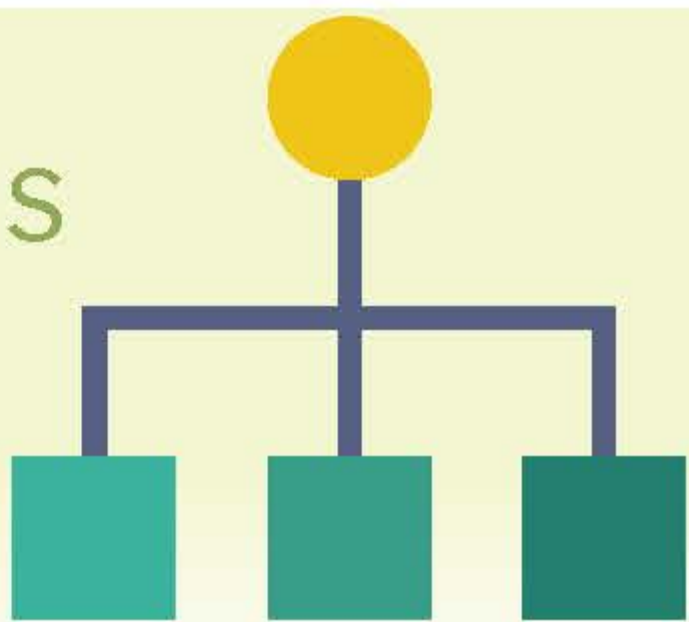

LILLY ENDOWMENT GIFT VI CHALLENGE MET

Together, we met the match! The Community Foundation successfully completed Lilly Endowment Inc.'s Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) challenge in March. The sixth phase of the GIFT initiative offered Pulaski County half a million dollars if it raised matching funds between August of 2014 and March 31, 2016.

GIFT VI offered a \$1 : \$1 match for unrestricted donations and a 50% match for gifts to new or existing restricted funds. A proposal for a community pool project was approved by the CFPC Board late in the challenge period, enabling donations for the project to be eligible for matching dollars as well.

Nearly 450 gifts were received during GIFT VI, and more than 125 individuals, businesses, and community organizations came together to raise an amazing \$728,284. The majority of contributions were invested in permanent endowment funds where the principal is invested to provide annual earnings for grants. 11 new funds were created, with several directed for specific charitable purposes and scholarships, and the rest as unrestricted endowments.

Combined with Lilly's half million dollars, \$1,228,284 was raised during GIFT VI and added to Community Foundation funds. More than \$468,000 is dedicated for future community needs and projects to "light the future" for our county.



"The success of the Community Foundation in GIFT VI rests with the many generous donors who helped to leverage contributions from Lilly Endowment," said Wendy Rose, executive director. "CFPC Board members must also be credited for their intensive efforts during the matching challenge to share the importance of building endowment for the future of our county. The Foundation will be better able to respond to community challenges because of our success in GIFT VI."

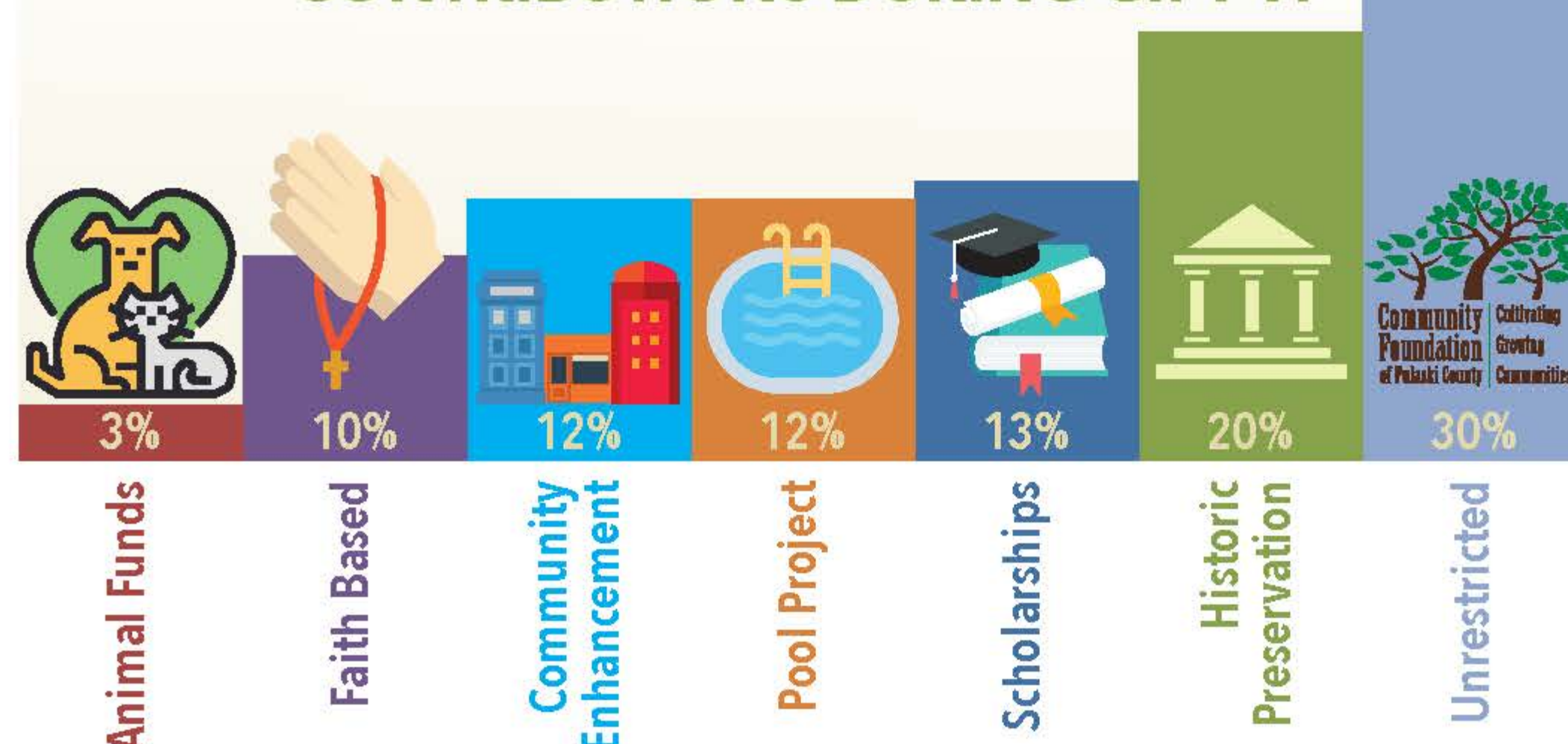

DON CHAPMAN

CREATIVE WRITING MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Harriet Chapman established this fund in memory of her husband Don, a Winamac native and graduate. Although Don lived most of his life in Indianapolis and Atlanta, he loved returning to Winamac and was researching to write stories about his hometown at the time of his death. His passion throughout life was in creative writing and literature. He took classes in these areas and in filmmaking after retirement. This fund will provide scholarships for graduates of Winamac Community High School who show creative writing potential.



ELDEN AND MARY LEE GUTWEIN FAMILY FUND

Elden and Mary Lee Gutwein established this fund as part of the Giving Indiana Funds for Tomorrow (GIFT) VI Initiative. The Gutweins spend their winters in Florida, but their hearts are always home in Pulaski County. The two became more involved in philanthropy after the sale of Elden's successful business. An artist and author, Mary Lee is also a former community foundation board member. The Gutweins give back because of the lasting impact philanthropy can have on a community and its residents. This endowed fund will forever provide annual support for the changing needs of Pulaski County.

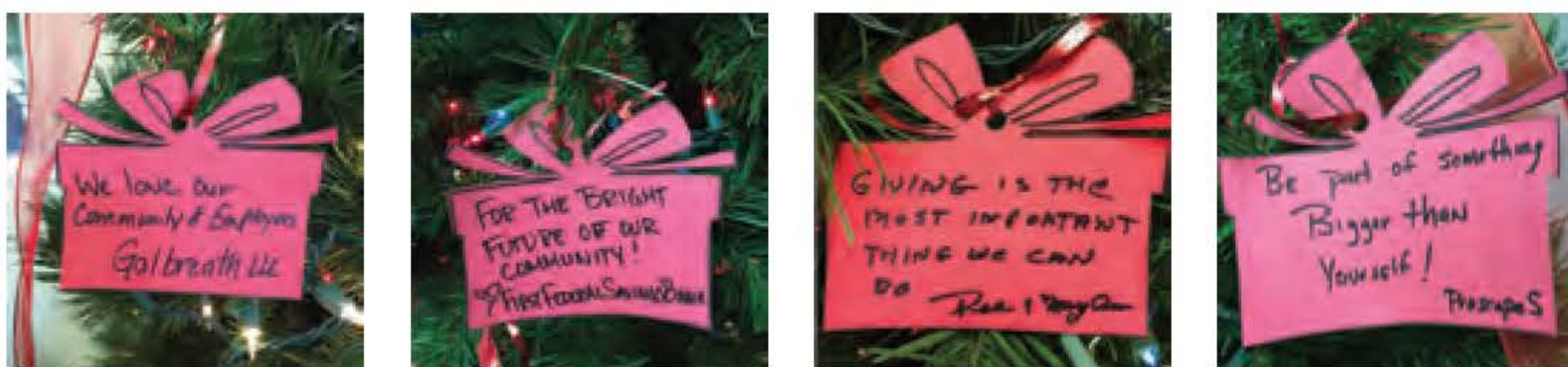


#GIVINGTUESDAY

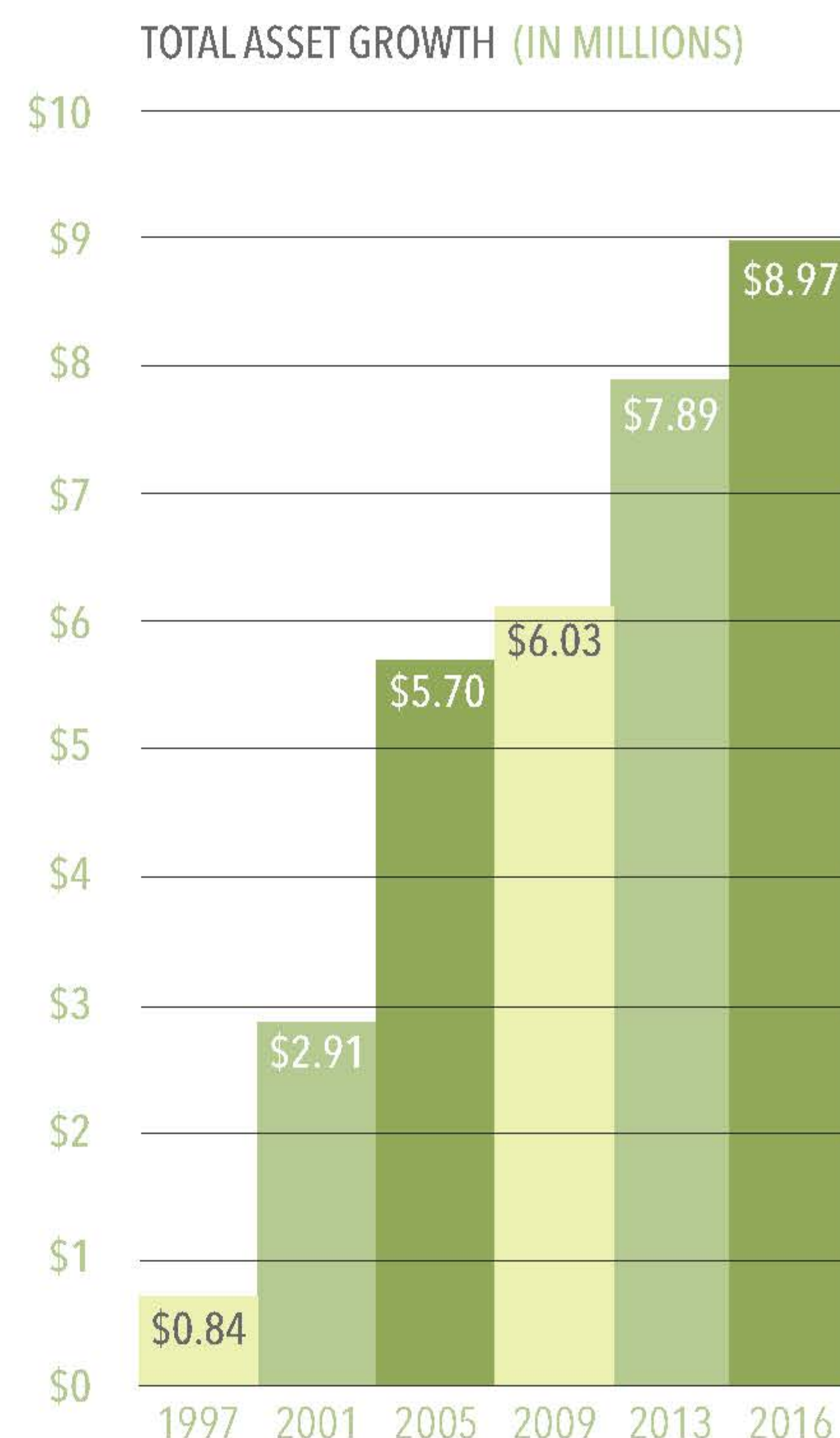

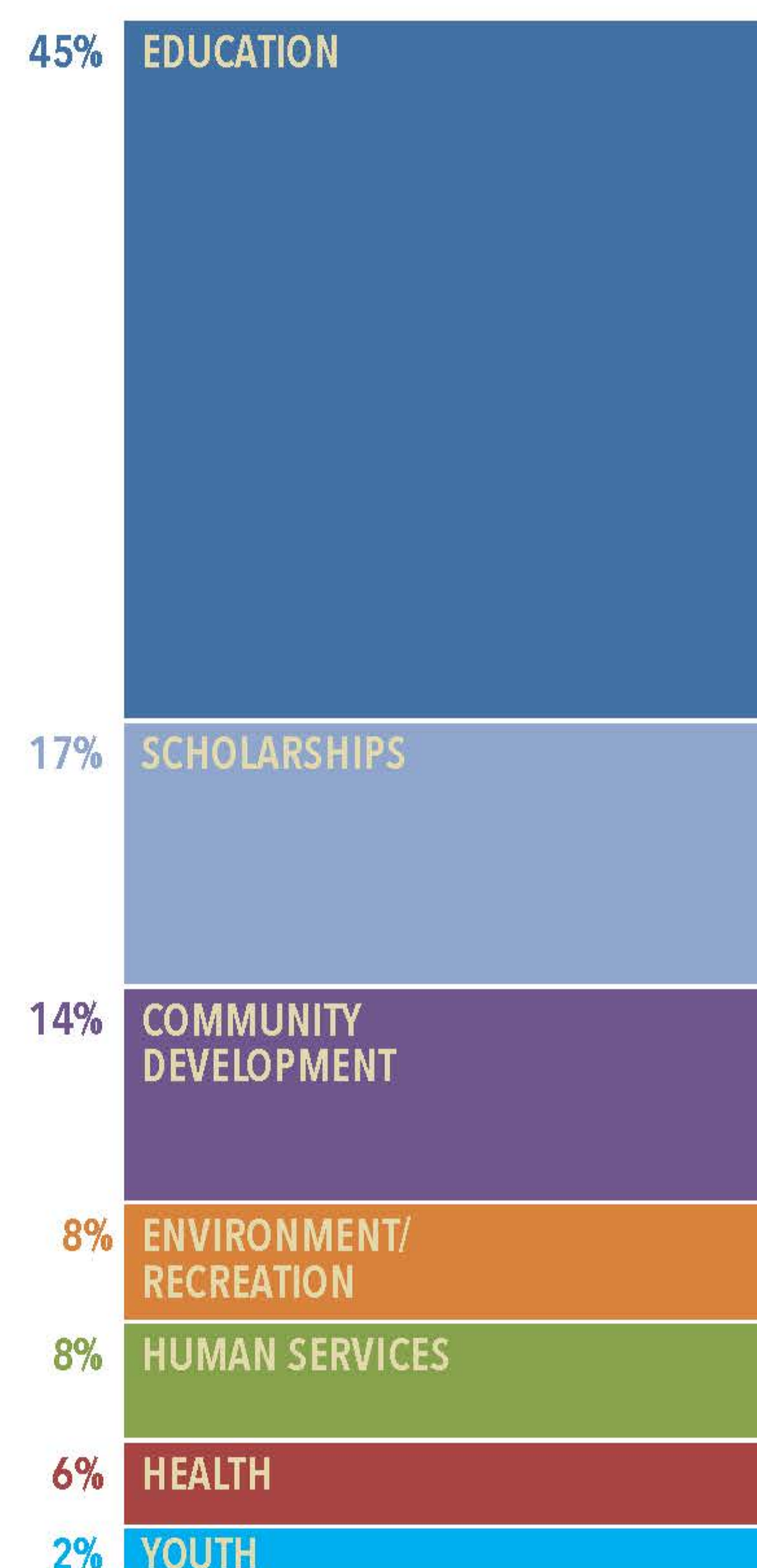
