For 12 years, the Casa Hogar Oasis de los Niños has been a refuge for children at risk in the Mexico state of Nuevo Leon. They've seen life at its worst and have the scars - emotional, mental, physical, and spiritual to prove it. Yet, God has placed this need on Mario and Blanca's hearts - to maintain a place of safety and security for them at a great cost to their own retirement years. Our teams have served there every year except one since its beginnings and we've seen a lot of kids come and go through its gates, and a lot of house parents as well. For the past three years, Phil and Marissa Sprenger and their 3 children, have volunteered 3 to 6 months each winter, living on site at the Casa complex. They've served a number of roles, mostly integrating into

the lives of the kids and staff, teaching them skills in the kitchen, in the shop, and in life in general. They humbly serve, generously share, and furiously love the people there. God has always supplied for their needs and we are thrilled that God has again provided and they will stay on until mid-June.

The attack is on though, and we are asking you to join us in a bold new prayer for the Casa Hogar. We've seen many of the children leave the home because of age, schooling, or other circumstances, and turn to a life of testing out the ways of the world. It's very difficult to watch and we won't let it go on unchecked. We have a tool in our arsenal that we have not been wielding very well, but we're going to change that. Please join us in this bold prayer.

Lord God, this place is to be a place to bring children out of danger and into safety. out of darkness and into the light, out of bondage and into freedom, out of brokenness into wholeness. We are boldly coming before you to ask You for this to be the heritage of the Casa Hogar Oasis de los Niños.
