# **Ron's Column**

I Peter 5:7 says: "Cast <u>all</u> your anxiety (cares) on him because he cares for you." How are you doing with that directive, with that instruction? Peter did not write this as a mere suggestion. We know that God cares for us. He loves us to the max. We don't have much trouble accepting that. But we are so independent and proud and somewhat self-centered, that we don't always trust him with our troubles. We think we can handle them by ourselves. That's not wise. So many times I try to do things all by myself (and some things are getting harder and harder to do), then my wife will say, "Why don't you let me help you?" And she will say, "Becky is here. She can help you do that." Do I want to ask for assistance? Well...not really. But when I do, the job goes faster and easier and many times better than when I tried to do it all by myself. Maybe it didn't used to be like that, but it is now.

God wants to help us. He longs to help us. James 4:8 tells us to "Come near to God and he will come near to you." Then in verse 10 he writes "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will lift you up." It takes humility to come to the Lord and to trust him with our cares and anxieties. It is not a sign of weakness and defeat on our part. It is a sign of strength and wisdom and maturity.

If God can speak the universe into existence, if God can free the Hebrew children from Pharaoh, part the Red Sea so they could escape, feed them in the desert for 40 years, etc., if God could spare Joseph's life and make him second in command in Egypt, rescue three young men from a fiery furnace, cause the widow's jar of flour and jug of oil not to run dry, cause some ravens to feed Elijah in the dessert, cause a virgin to have a baby, raise Lazarus, Jairus' daughter, and the widow of Nain's son from the dead, calm storms with just a word, feed 5,000 then 4,000 with just a very little bit of food, and I could go on and on and on, then he can help us bear our burdens and get us through our tough times.

Tough times come in the form of health issues, financial issues, family problems, relationship problems, work problems, school problems, spiritual problems, but praise the Lord, he can handle them all. But we have to take our problems to him, lay them all out, talk to him about them, then trust him to do his thing. Romans 8:28 says "And we know that in ALL THINGS God works for the GOOD of those who LOVE him, who have been called according to his purpose.

One of our names is Believers. Let's truly believe in the Lord in all things, in all areas, and cast all of our anxieties and cares on him.
