I was listening to a Southern Gospel singer this past week and he said he had experienced several losses this past year. Then he said "You have to expect losses and deal with them when they come." I wish I remembered what song he sang next. I'm sure it was very appropriate to make his point.

A few days after Memorial Day, I visited the Clay City Cemetery. I had a strange feeling that day as I stood close by eleven graves of relatives. I looked out further from that spot and counted a total of twenty-one graves of relatives who were buried in that cemetery. There were my four grandparents, my parents, eleven aunts and uncles, and four cousins. Then I thought of the twelve other aunts and uncles who are buried in various other cemeteries. Oh the memories that came flooding back that day.

But there are other losses we experience other than just deaths. There are the loss of a job, loss of health, loss of energy and stamina, fading sight, hearing, taste, memory, etc. Then there is the loss of personal freedom, loss of personal control of our lives and bodies. There is the loss of driving privileges, loss of long time friends, and the loss of family members as they have moved away. And this list goes on and on.

Oh, boy! This has gotten depressing. Sorry! But losses are a big part of life whether we like it or not and they come to everyone on the planet. But as the singer said, we need to expect them (not morbidly or fearfully), but be realistic and then do what we can to prepare for them. Then when they come, we need to deal with them in a positive way. Yes, I know. That's not easy, not easy at all.

How does a Christian cope with loss? I don't have enough space in this whole newsletter to thoroughly cover that topic.

But. . . let me give a condensed answer. God is real! We need to believe completely in Him and His Word. We need to let our losses draw us closer to the Lord and strengthen our faith. We need to use our faith to face and move through those loses.


We need to use the power of prayer in good times and bad, and use it abundantly.
