
Connect Groups

From Dusty's Desk:

Send Them Running

When Jesus sent out the Twelve disciples on their first mission trip, He divided them into pairs. You can find the pairings in Matthew 10. At the bottom of the list is the last pair--Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot. The Zealots were like the Irish IRA. They were quick to fight and always willing to take up arms against Rome. And we know what Judas was. Mark Moore wrote that this must have been a "spunky team"!

One interesting bit of instruction Jesus gave them is found in Matthew 10:23 which says, "When you are persecuted in one place, flee to another." When they saw trouble rising, they were to run away to the next place. Paul followed this advice over and over again in his ministry. Now understand that when they fled, it was not because of fear. They fled because they still had work to do. Their premature deaths would have been a blow to Jesus' plan for the building of His Kingdom.

The disciples had no reason to fear their enemies, neither on earth, nor in the heavenly realms. Jesus had made it clear that He had authority over everything and He gave that same authority to the disciples. Jesus gives us His authority too--the authority to lead others to Christ, knowing He will accept those we bring to Him--the authority to rescue people from Satan's hold.

In fact, Satan was afraid of Jesus, so it stands to reason that He fears anyone who has Jesus living inside them. James 4:7 says, "Resist the devil, and he will flee from you." Just as the disciples were told to flee from persecution, we are told that Satan will flee from us if we put up a fight.

In "It's A Wonderful Life", the annoying little girl says, "Every time a bell rings, an angel gets his wings." That's not biblical at all, but this is: "Every time a Christian witnesses, a demon wets his pants!" Demons were terrified of Jesus. When we look like Jesus, talk like Jesus and act like Jesus, demons are terrified of us. We have no reason to fear. Serve the Lord with all your heart. He will go with you, provide for you, protect you and give you success for the sake of His Kingdom.

He may have been preparing us all along so that we can be strong, more determined, and full of wisdom to face the end stages of life.

A preacher friend shared this quote that he read in some devotional material recently: "Suffering isn't an obstacle to being used by God. It is an opportunity to be used like never before."

I'm thinking of the Apostle Paul. It seems like the older he got the more problems he had. He had some health issues that never got any better, only worse. His work of planting and growing churches seemed to only get more difficult the older he got. But God used him in great ways despite the problems and seeming setbacks and age.
