This way in...

On Being Influential...

As a church, we take discipleship very seriously. Being and making disciples is our work and passion at Red Hill. As we grow in faith through the power of the Holy Spirit, one consequence that flows from this spiritual growth and discipleship is *godly influence*. What is Godly influence? Well, the dictionary defines influence as: “the capacity to have an effect on the character, development, or behavior of someone or something...” Godly influence is having an effect on someone for the glory of God. Godly influence flows from God through you to others. You influence people every day through your smile, conversations, email, attitudes, etc.

God will use you to influence others. We can call it “witnessing,” “helping,” and/or “serving,” but whatever we call it, being influential for Jesus Christ is one way that God changes hearts and heals this world.

I thought about the issue of influence recently when I received an article from Pastor Rick Warren of Saddleback Church. I think it is safe to say that Saddleback Church has had enormous influence in this community and in the world. Rick Warren wrote to local pastors, encouraging us to be “kingdom builders,” leaders who lead churches dedicated to the alternative values of the Kingdom of God, and through this dedication, developing disciples who are Godly influences in the world.

All churches (and the individual disciples who constitute those churches) can and should be influential—meaning, that we desire and express the “things of God.” His love, mercy, and power that flows through us to others for God’s glory and others’ blessing. I thought I would share parts of this article with you so that you may think about how God can use you, and Red Hill, to be a community of faith that is influential for the Kingdom of God! Rick Warren writes:

Everyone has influence. We all influence someone. And that God expects us to be good stewards of that influence [to build His kingdom]...I define “kingdom builder” as one who as a great purpose

to live for, great principles to live by, great power to live on, and great people to live with...I want to share...six principles of influence today:

If I use my influence well, God will give me more.

In Matthew 25, Jesus told a parable about the stewardship of influence in which a ruler had left several stewards in charge of different amounts of money. When he returned and found that two of the three had earned an increase on the money he told them each, “*Well done, good and faithful servant! You have been faithful with a few things; I will put you in charge of many things. Come and share your master’s happiness!*” This is a powerful principle to learn concerning God’s economy. God rewards our faithful influence with more influence.

The path to greater influence is service and generosity.

We assume that we must climb to higher positions in order to have more influence, but Jesus gave us an ethic of influence that started with stooping to serve instead. He put it this way: “*But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant*” Matthew 20:26 (NLT). We influence people with far more powerful results when we lead by serving.

You only influence people who trust you.

In other words, credibility is everything when it comes to leadership and influence. There are at least five ways for Christian leaders to develop trust with people.

- By praying for and with people.
- By setting a faithful example.
- By continually speaking truth.
- By encouraging and celebrating unity.
- By exhibiting courage as you lead.

Criticism is the inevitable price of influence.

Criticism isn’t fun. Life gets hard when you become a target, but that’s the inevitable result of an expanding influence. The more visible you are,

the more of a target you will be. This was true for King David, for Nehemiah, and for Jesus as well as anyone who has been a mover and shaker in the history of the church. Embrace criticism as the blessed side effect of influence.

The fastest way to influence is by being likable.

This is not to say that being likable is more important than other values, but when we decide to show a genuine interest in other people, they tend to be interested in you, and this is often the gateway to influence.

Kingdom builders help others use their influence wisely.

Great leaders sharpen other leaders and influencers grow each other in community. Kingdom builders are not merely interested in having followers, but in raising up other leaders. The Kingdom needs good leadership now more than ever. Will you put these principles to work in your life and be a Kingdom builder?

That is a great question! Will we put these principles to work in our lives? If not these, what principles can you live by that empower you to be a Godly influence to others through your life?

I ask for your prayers that at Red Hill Lutheran Church and School, we continue to grow in influence for Jesus, being used by Him to change the hearts of those God brings into our lives!

May God lead and guide you on the way!

“Fighting the Good Fight: 1 Peter”

Summer Sermon Series

In June, we began our summer sermon series, “Fighting the Good Fight: 1 Peter.” Written in the early decade of 60 A.D., the church was facing severe persecution under the Emperor Nero. Peter encourages the church to stand strong and live as “foreigners and aliens in a strange land, placing their hope and confidence in God. As T.R. Schreiner writes:

When believers live in such a way, they indicate that they are placing their hope in God rather than in the joys and comforts of this world. Another way of describing 1 Peter is to say that those who hope and trust in God and in his future reward will have the strength to endure whatever comes their way in the present. When believers set their hope on the future, they reveal that their salvation comes from the cross of Christ, who bore their sins (2:24; 3:18)...Since the end is coming soon, believers should imitate Jesus Christ and follow his example of suffering, for all those who suffer will also experience a great reward.¹

The goals of this series are to understand the context and message of 1 Peter, as well as the challenges and threats the church faces in every age. And, through this understanding, to encourage and equip disciples of Jesus to persevere in their daily lives by living godly lives, being good citizens in the community, and being a faithful worker, spouse, and friend. Join us, as we examine:

July 30th: “Life in the Body.” Texts: 1 Peter 4.7-11; John 15.1-11

August 6th: “Dealing With Suffering.” Texts: 1 Peter 4.12-19; John 15.18-16.4

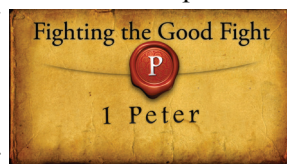
August 13th: “Humility.” Texts: 1 Peter 5.1-5; Matthew 16.13-20

August 20th: “The Roaring Lion.” Texts: 1 Peter 5.6-11; Luke 14.7-14

August 27th: “Always Hope.” Texts: 1 Peter 5.12-14; Mark 6.45-52

Do you struggle to live faithfully in our world today? Are you finding it “harder” to be a person of faith in an increasingly hostile culture? Join us as we explore the history and circumstances of the early church and how God called His people then, and calls His people now, to be faithful and persevere through times of conflict, challenge, and even persecution.

BIBLE STUDY & THEOLOGY

Summer Sunday Study Series

Intertestamental Times

Join us this summer for our study of the Intertestamental Times. Many Christians have studied the Old Testament, and many Christians have studied the New Testament. But too few have studied the times between the Testaments. That’s what this class is all about. More than just a history lesson, it sets the context for our understanding of the New Testament and the life and preaching of Jesus.

This class explores key historical moments and literary works of Judaism’s Second Temple period. The course covers Israel’s return from Babylonian exile, beginning in 583 BC, to the destruction of the Jerusalem temple in AD 70. The course also surveys a vast array of Second Temple literature, from the OT Apocrypha to the writings of Philo and Josephus.

C. H. Dodd, biblical scholar and professor at Oxford and Cambridge, once described the ideal interpreter of the New Testament: “The ideal interpreter would be one who has entered into the strange first-century world, has felt its whole strangeness, has sojourned into it so that they have lived themselves into it, thinking and feeling as one of those to whom the Gospel first came, and then who will return to their own world.” Get the point that Dodd is making. He’s not saying that they stay in that sort of ancient world but, rather, that they go there, they discover the world there, but then they come back to their own world and give the truth that they discerned in that ancient context.

This class utilizes video lectures from Joel Willitts, a professor in the biblical and theological studies department at North Park University. He has researched and published several books, essays, and journal articles on the New Testament’s Jewish context.

The Epistle (letter) of Galatians has been referred to as a “mini book of Romans.” Meaning that the Biblical doctrine of salvation by grace through faith alone through Jesus, so well described by Paul in his letter to the Romans, finds additional description (and defense) in Paul’s much shorter letter to the churches in the provenance of Galatia.

Why did Paul describe and defend this critical point of

theology? Because as human beings, we so very quickly believe that we have to do something to earn God's favor; to be accepted by our Heavenly Father! Not only that, but there will always be people who believe and will insist that the Gospel, the good news that Jesus died for us of course, "gets us to heaven." However now, we must show God that we are serious, and worthy to be in His presence. Paul addresses this and other misunderstandings of the Gospel as he writes to the early churches.

This misunderstanding of the Gospel is as prevalent today as it was in the first-century. This is one reason why the message of Galatians needs to be heard and believed as we seek to follow Jesus today and understand His love and grace that transforms our hearts!

You are invited to join us on Wednesday mornings as we study Galatians verse-by-verse. You are always welcome to join us at any point in our class! In this class we also sing, pray, and, after the study, many head over to Coco's Restaurant in Tustin for breakfast. Hope to see you!

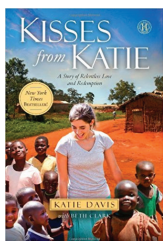
