

Seeing another class of preschoolers walk by the door of my office, waving. Children bring a lot of life and joy into our church building.


Sharing in the wedding of Dudley Raine and Suzanne Edmunds in the outdoor chapel. It was a distinctively Saint Andrew celebration.

Watching goofy sixth graders follow the example of their older peers on Youth Sunday, and then gradually mature into eleventh and twelfth graders who set the right example for the younger students, leading the church in worship.

Seeing a new columbarium sprout and blossom outside my office window (2005); Seeing the church family share meals in a beautiful and spacious new fellowship hall and having a space set aside for our middle and high school students to make their own (2012); Having a room in the church dedicated to the practice of prayer (2014); Getting a large, attractive church nursery after decades of enduring a crowded,

bowling alley-like room, and watching the preschool thrive in a space that reflects the excellence of their program (2016).

All of the 32 baptisms I shared at Saint Andrew are dear to me, but I'll never forget the Fortune girls. After baptizing an apprehensive Summer Fortune in the outdoor chapel, her sister, Skyler, couldn't wait: *Do me now!* (Of course, baptizing my own granddaughter, Caroline, was another very special day.)

Serving the poor with our students—in Jamaica, Washington, and Philadelphia.

Seeing 50 people waiting to cheer me on outside the Pearson Cancer Center before my final session of chemotherapy on May 15, 2017.

Gary Foster and the Chancel Choir (under several directors), as well as Matt Hildebrand and our Jubilee musicians, leading us into the presence of God Sunday after Sunday.

Conducting the memorial services for so many of our saints, but especially the joint service for Paul and Nancy Childers. They were married over 71 years, members of Saint Andrew for 59 years, and died just days apart. I first met Paul and Nancy when I hired them to call a square dance at Rivermont Presbyterian where I served at the time.

The tears that often streamed from my eyes when our Liturgical Dance Team participated in worship.

Leading the singing at many frantic weeks of Vacation Bible School. Struggling to teach an old, non-dancing brain the words and motions to a new set of songs and then, by the end of the week, seeing a roomful of children transformed into a group of active worshipers singing praises to God.



These are just a few of the many good memories you've given me. Thank you.
