## NEXT SUNDAY'S FOCUS: MEMBERSHIP QUALIFICATIONS

*Membership in the Church has been a debated topic since the beginning. Who belongs? Who doesn't?*

*We seem to hear one set of qualifications in the first reading and another implied in the Gospel.*

*But there is a common denominator. Thank God—literally!—for the Holy Spirit!*

### FIRST READING

*It is the decision of the Holy Spirit and of us not to place on you any burden beyond these necessities (Acts 15:1-2, 22-29).*

The Church has always been guided by the Holy Spirit, but it was not always easy to discern what the Spirit wants. One of the most difficult problems in the early Church was to decide what Christ wanted of the first Gentiles. Baptism initiated pagans into the faith. But what were they becoming when they were baptized? They were actually becoming Jews, for they were committing themselves to the Messiah whom the God of Israel had sent. Now that they were Jews, how much of

the Jewish faith should they observe? Should they be circumcised? Should they keep the dietary laws? In order to discern God's will in this matter, the apostles gather in Jerusalem. The final decision was that the pagans should not be obligated to follow Jewish law. They were to live in the freedom of the children of God. Though this decision was reached through discussion and compromise, the Holy Spirit was behind it all. This is often how the Spirit acts, through normal human interaction.

### SECOND READING

*The angel showed me the Holy City coming down out of Heaven (Revelation 21:10-14, 22-23).*

The description of the heavenly Jerusalem is pictured as a city built out of precious stones. Its beauty recalls the description of God the Father in Chapter 4 in the Book of Revelations. We will be like God for we will see Him as He is. The twelve gates and the twelve courses of stones recall the twelve patriarchs

and the twelve apostles who are the founders of the Old and New Israel. There is no temple in the city, for there is no place where God cannot be found. When the veil of the temple was split at the moment of Jesus' death, the separation between God and the world was forever shattered.

### GOSPEL

*The Holy Spirit will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you (John 14:23-29).*

This is the last Sunday before the Ascension,

and we are preparing for the descent of the Holy Spirit. This is why the First Reading spoke of the action of the Holy Spirit through the discussions of the community and the Gospel speaks of the coming of the Advocate. It was necessary for Jesus to ascend to the Father. This was the Father's will, and we should be filled with joy that Jesus was doing what the Father had requested of Him (even if it is difficult for us to accept this).

### REFLECTION

Groucho Marx once said, "I don't want to

belong to any club that would have someone like me for a member." We laugh because usually the opposite is the case. We don't want to belong to any club that would have anyone very different from ourselves as a member. The Church, however, is true to its calling when the welcome mat is out for all. Acts gives us a "tweeter's" version of the early council of Jerusalem on the issue of whether Gentiles can be received into the community without circumcision and accepting the Law of Moses. Take some time to read all of Chapter 15 to hear the three important speeches that determined the conditions for the outcome of this debate. The final decision was reached under two influences: "the Holy Spirit and us" — the "us" being Peter, Barnabas and Paul, and James, leader of the Church in Jerusalem. In a more intimate manner of expression, though no less binding, Jesus speaks about the requirements for having the Father and Him come to dwell with the disciples: "Whoever loves Me will keep My word." That "word" we heard this week, His great commandment: Love one another as I have loved you. Jesus gives further assurance: "The Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." In both instances the Holy Spirit is recognized. May the Holy Spirit always continue to work on the Church's membership drive and guide the deliberations of its leaders.

# FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

## *Reconcile Yourself To God And Others*

**WE ARE ABLE TO LOVE AS JESUS DID ONLY BECAUSE OF THE POWER AND GRACE WHICH COME FROM OUR FIRST BEING LOVED BY GOD.** God's dwelling is now "with the human race" (second reading). God transforms us into those who love as the divine Son loved. On our own we cannot love as Jesus did. The power of the resurrection is that Jesus' risen life now pulses within us. It is this life which gives us the ability to live Jesus' new commandment of love.

**TODAY'S GOSPEL** is so familiar that we are likely to let it flow over us without paying much attention to what it is saying. There is one word in it, however, that should give us pause. That word is "as." Big problems can come in small packages.

**THE COMMANDMENT OF UNIVERSAL LOVE** makes a lot of sense. It is really no more than an affirmation of human solidarity and of our nature as social beings. We all recognize that the world would be a better place if we all followed this path. Why we do not is a great mystery, the answer to which would probably win us a Nobel Peace Prize.

**LOVING EVERYONE** may be dauntingly difficult, but that is still not enough for Jesus. The commandment he proposes is that we love others in the same way as he

did." As I have loved you, so you also should love one another." This recalls those other hard sayings of the Gospel, "Forgive us as we forgive" and "Be Perfect as you heavenly Father is perfect." Before such words as these we probably feel as overcome as the first disciples did when they exclaimed, "Who, then, can be saved?" (Mark 10:26).

**JESUS' RESPONSE** to them should also strengthen our resolve. "For human beings it is impossible, but not for God; all things are possible for God" (Mark 10:27). When a commandment is given, God also gives us the grace to fulfill it. Jesus' instruction to love as he loved is not a mere precept; it is a promise. More than that, it is what is given us in the gift of new life, a new heart, capable of

a wider loving. The gift is an answer to St Augustine's prayer: "Give what you command, and then command whatever you will."

**BY OUR OWN SELF-SACRIFICING LOVE**, we are the presence of the risen Christ for others. Christian living is, bottom line, to love as Jesus loved, to be the risen Christ for others. The divine love to which Jesus calls us produces dramatic results: "a new heaven and a new earth," a "new Jerusalem," indeed the making of "all things new" (second reading). This love wipes away every tear and lasts forever. Our Easter joy is not found in avoiding its costs, but in embracing its price for the sake of the new heaven and earth it promises. By loving as Jesus did, we are transformed, and so is all the world. And this newness will last forever.

## SACRED SPACE REFLECTION

### Something to think and pray about this week...

**EASTER IS THE TIME** when we remember and celebrate the new life which comes to us through our Risen Lord. What do we mean by "new life"? Can we say that we have experienced "new life" this Easter or, for that matter, in any previous Easter? Are we aware of becoming changed in any way – for the better – over the years? Or is the Easter experience simply passing us by? The word "new" appears several times in today's readings. Revelation speaks of a "new" heaven, a "new" earth and a "new" Jerusalem.

### In the Gospel Jesus speaks of a "new" commandment.

What he tells us is to love other people – and to love them as he has loved us. This, Jesus says, is a "new" commandment. The word "love", can lead to misunderstandings. It is mainly used by us in contexts which imply deep affection, emotional attraction and good feelings when the beloved is around or even just thought of. Although wonderful - this is not quite the meaning that Jesus had in mind. Jesus called us to a love that reaches out to others in a caring attitude for their wellbeing, irrespective of whether there will be a similar response by them. It is the compassion that Jesus shows for the sinner.

**To incorporate this level of love in our lives will call for a new way** of thinking, of seeing, of behaving and of interacting with other people. And it will be the test, the only valid test, of whether I truly love God as well.

*Think about this — is this the way, the frame of mind in which I live my day?  
Is this the way we – who call ourselves Christians – live our normal days?*

**Today — is in our hands. All we have to do is follow the lead of Jesus the Lord.**

### The Same And Yet, Not The Same

When the disciples  
met Jesus  
on the road,

I RECEIVED AN INVITATION IN THE MAIL the other day for the wedding of the son of a friend whom I had grown up with. She and I were often partners in crime, both in grade school and high school. She also stood up for my wedding! Receiving that invitation put me in a reflective mood and I spent several hours reminiscing about my own wedding preparations: all the excitement—and agony—over deciding what color to use, choosing the bridesmaid dresses, the hall, the menu, and on and on and on. And, of course, the thrill of the wedding day itself! The music was perfect, seeing old friends and family warmed my heart and celebrating with them afterward was such fun!

The week that followed on our honeymoon was filled with continued reflections on it. How we felt saying “I do,” how the church looked, how the flowers smelled, and the reception!!! All the funny moments, happy moments, sad moments....these filled our conversations as we reveled in the joy of being Mr. and Mrs. And in being with each other.

But, eventually, we had to get back to “normal.” Reality set in as work schedules kicked back in, meals needed to be cooked, clothes washed, floors vacuumed, grass cut. And soon a whole new set of emotions came into play. How do I really relate to this person? How can I integrate my “old” identity with my “new” identity? After all, I’m still the same person... and yet, I’m not.

All these things flashed through my mind in an instant as I looked at that invitation and I realized that my life, even now, is in a state of integration. I am constantly changing.

There is an old saying, “You never step into the same river twice.” The fast moving

water changes the contours of the riverbed even as you watch it. Our lives are so very much like those fast moving waters.

AS MUCH AS I AM CHANGING, SO, TOO, ARE OUR “NEOPHYTES.” That is the formal name for the RCIA candidates who were Baptized, Received and Confirmed in the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil this year. They have basked in the glow of that Vigil! Having the waters of Baptism poured over them in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; making a Profession of Faith by confirming their belief in all that the Church teaches; being anointed with the Holy Chrism in Confirmation; and finally, joining with the community of St. Elizabeth Seton in communion, the sacrament that binds us to God and to one another. They have recalled the look, the smell, and the emotions of that evening.

But now, another set of feelings are surfacing. They are realizing that “they’ve only just begun.” These sacraments were not the present in the box, they were only the wrapping around it!!! And they are coming to realize that they are the same people....and yet, they are not. In the coming years they will continue to delve more deeply into the mystery of God. They may come to understand some things that many of us understand now. And they will trust that more things will become clear in the future.

ALL OF US, WHETHER WE ARE NEW neophytes, or old-time Catholics, are continually stepping into that river, discovering anew what our mission in Christ is and settling into it, at least for the moment. What our mission will be is the journey we take as followers of Christ. The memories are great, the reality is even better!!

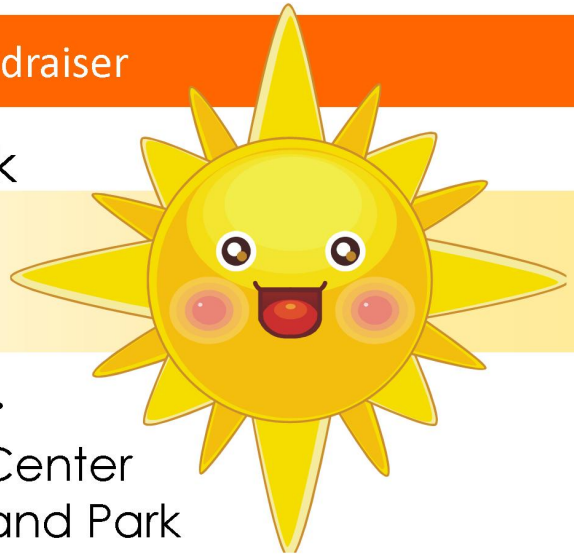

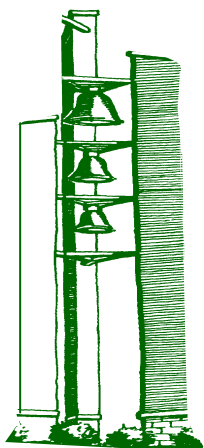

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA

1347-1380

THE VALUE CATHERINE MAKES CENTRAL IN HER SHORT LIFE AND WHICH SOUNDS CLEARLY AND CONSISTENTLY THROUGH HER EXPERIENCE IS COMPLETE SURRENDER TO CHRIST. What is most impressive is that she learns to view her surrender to her Lord as a goal to be reached through time. She was the 23rd child of Jacopo and Lapa Benincasa and grew up as an intelligent, cheerful and intensely religious person. Catherine cut off her hair in protest against being overly encouraged to improve her appearance to attract a husband. Her father ordered her to be left in peace, and she was given a room of her own for prayer and meditation.

She entered the Dominican Third Order at 18 and spent three years in seclusion, prayer and austerity. Gradually a group of followers gathered around her—men and women, priests and religious. An active public apostolate grew out of her contemplative life. Her letters, mostly for spiritual instruction and encouragement of her followers, took note of public affairs. Opposition and slander resulted from her mixing fearlessly with the world and speaking with the candor and authority of one completely committed to Christ. She was cleared of all charges at the Dominican General Chapter of 1374.

Her public influence reached great heights because of her evident holiness, her membership in the Dominican Third Order, and the deep impression she made on the pope. She worked tirelessly for the crusade against the Turks and for peace between Florence and the pope.

In 1378, the Great Schism began, splitting the allegiance of Christendom between two, then three, popes and putting even saints on opposing sides. Catherine spent the last two years of her life in Rome, in prayer and pleading on behalf of the cause of Urban VI and the unity of the Church. She offered herself as a victim for the Church in its agony. She died surrounded by her "children" and was canonized in 1461.

Catherine ranks high among the mystics and spiritual writers of the Church. In 1939, she and Francis of Assisi were declared co-patrons of Italy. Paul VI named her and Teresa of Avila doctors of the Church in 1970. Her spiritual testament is found in *The Dialogue*.

#### COMMENT:

Catherine of Siena stands as a companion with us on the Christian journey in her undivided effort to invite the Lord to take flesh in her own life. Events which might make us wince or chuckle or even yawn fill her biographies: a mystical experience at six, childhood betrothal to Christ, stories of harsh asceticism, her frequent ecstatic visions. Still, Catherine lived in an age which did not know the rapid change of 21st-century mobile America. The value of her life for us today lies in her recognition of holiness as a goal to be sought over the course of a lifetime.

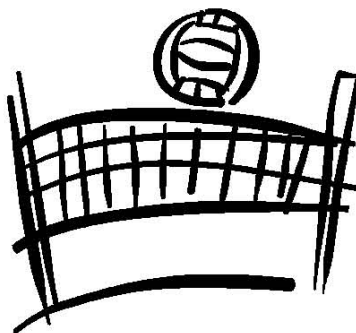
#### **Grades 1-8:**

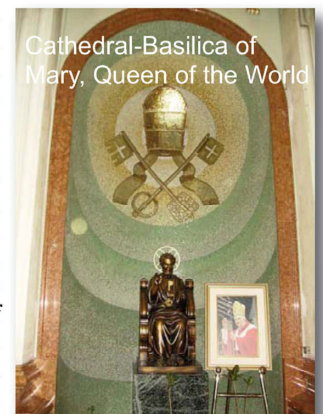

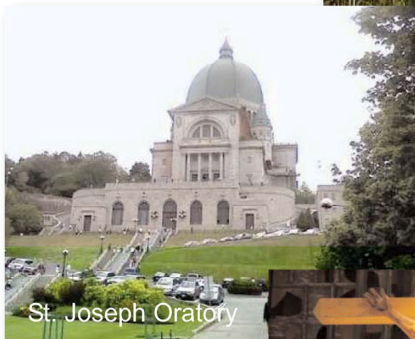

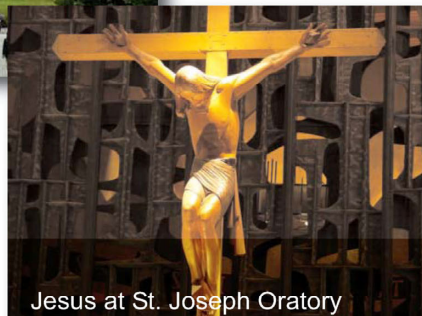

**Day 4 : Sept 22 (M) : MONTREAL / NOTRE DAME DU CAP**

After breakfast departure to Notre Dame du Cap (located at Trois-Rivières, half-way between Montreal and Quebec City), to meditate at Our Lady of the Cape Shrine, the largest sanctuary to the Virgin Mary in North America, with the miraculous Statue of Our Lady of the Cap. With magnificent stained-glass windows, a 75-stop pipe organ, and an enormous park overlooking the St. Lawrence River, this is a supremely peaceful and contemplative site.

The very first church of the sanctuary was a small wooden structure built in 1659. Father Paul Vachon, its first resident pastor, instituted the Brotherhood of the Rosary in 1694. In 1714 began the construction of the second parish church that was opened for worship in 1720, replacing the first small wooden church. This second church, presently called the Old Shrine, and made with fieldstones, is still the oldest church in

Canada in which Mass is celebrated daily.

There will be time to cross the Rosary Bridge and walk the Way of the Rosary, as well as time to pray at the replica of the Holy Sepulchre.

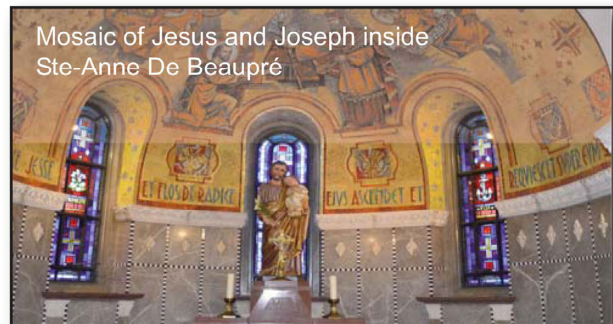
