United Methodist Women Past and Present

The United Methodist Women can trace their organization's roots back to 1869 when a group of women at Tremont Methodist Episcopal Church in Boston, Massachusetts, pooled their resources to send two women as missionaries to India. Through the years, the United Methodist Women has gone through many changes, just as the Methodist Church has. Today's organizational structure was established in 1972 and is part of the General Board of Global Ministries of the United Methodist Church.

Today, the United Methodist Women has about one million members. Close to \$20 million comes from United Methodist Women annually for programs and projects related to women, children and youth in the United States and in more than one hundred countries around the world! These gifts do not include another \$5 million collected and used by individual units. We have a long history of responding to God's grace by reaching out to persons in need.

We are the Ruths and Naomis of our time, living in a close relationship with one another and ensuring the spiritual growth, love, and nurture of each other along the journey of our lives.

Additionally, we believe that we are all servant leaders, using as our model, the perfect servant leader, Jesus Christ.

Circles

What is a Circle? The dictionary says it's a group of people assembled about a central point of interest, or bound by a common tie. Within the UMW, Circles are small groups of women who meet on a monthly basis to study, pray, discuss projects for missions, and fellowship. The bonds that form in these small group meetings help support and nurture the women at Saint Mark.

The Serendipity Circle meets the second Monday of each month (except summer months) during the day at the church with special trips and outings.

You do not have to be a member of a circle to be a member of United Methodist Women. We have Link Up meetings throughout the year, plus many other events and activities.

Membership

Membership is open to any woman who indicates her desire to belong and to participate in the global mission of the Church through United Methodist Women.

Pledges and Missions

Making a pledge to the United Methodist Women is voluntary and the amount is whatever an individual wants to pledge.

All pledge money is used for the Missions of the United Methodist Women. Mission giving supports institutions and programs empowering and improving the lives of women, youth and children in the United States and around the world. It provides food, shelter, education, employment, healthcare and human rights advocacy for many living on the margins of society. Mission giving supports United Methodist mission personnel and retired Deaconesses. United Methodist Women's mission giving also funds spiritual growth programs, leadership development events and mission education opportunities for United Methodist Women members.

Saint Mark United Methodist Women also has various fundraising projects throughout the year to help support our missions here and around the world.
