

eeting Christ at the Crossroads of the Gospels is the theme of our 2014 Adult Retreat to be led by Dr. Tom Long on Jan. 31-Feb 2 at the luxurious Bishop's Lodge in Santa Fe, NM.

Tom Long is a speaker, preacher, and teacher in great demand across the nation. He serves as the Bandy Professor of Preaching at Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia. Tom resident his Bandy Albita for a Falling Candidate.

In 1996, Dr. Long was named one of the 12 most effective preachers in the English speaking world by Baylor University, along with the likes of Fred Craddock, Billy Graham, James Forbes, Barbara Brown Taylor, and William Willimon.
