Pastor Mike's Meditations





33rd General Assembly ALONE
June 18-22, 2013
Cherry Hills Community Church
Highlands Ranch, Colorado

The focus of General Assembly in Colorado Springs, CO was on what it means to be part of a "missional" denomination. Again and again, the speakers and leaders of the denomination challenged the church to be excited about missions beyond ourselves. What does it mean to be "missional"? The working definition of a missional church that the Evangelical Presbyterian Church approved at its 2008 General Assembly states that a missional church is one "that believes that the United States has become **post-Christian** and is now a mission field."

Another way to think of it, is for the church to be outwardly focused on the world which God so loves and for which Christ died. To be missional is to bring the church, which has largely been focused on attracting people to us, back into balance. That is, it is a realization that the Great Commission calls us to "go and make disciples of all nations…" (Mt. 28:19) not wait until the world comes to us.

What are some of the ways that the General Assembly was encouraging each congregation to be missional? One of the primary thrusts, was the focus on evangelism. In their presentation entitled, "In Christ Alone," Mark Mittleburg and Lee Strobel challenged each church to make, in my words, "a great commitment to the great commission."

Seven values or beliefs they encouraged us to adopt were:

- People matter to God-We need to care about people as God cares for and loves people.
- People are lost-Jesus came to seek and to save the lost.
- **People need Christ-**The bridge across the chasm is Christ alone. In the past evangelism was an event. Now people have moved further away from God, the church and you as a believer. So we need to see it as a process that is built through a relationship.
- People need answers to their questions and objections-Apologetics are still essential. We need to help people work through their intellectual roadblocks or searching questions (2 Corinthians 10:5, 1 Peter 3:15) (ex: Small Groups-Spiritual Discovery Groups)
- **Community-**If people don't get it in legitimate ways, they will look for it in illegitimate ways (Internet, etc.). We need to extend community in ways that bring them into right relationships.
- Relevancy-Learn to speak the language of the culture so that they understand the unique, unadulterated truth claims of Christ. We have to first cross or help to fill the cultural chasm (Jesus in John 3) (ex: Using the music they like)
- **Time-**The more the culture moves away the more time it takes. Evangelism is a process.

As I said in last month's article, one the aspects of our own congregation's mission is "Sharing the gospel with those around us..." In other words, one of our core values is to "practice evangelism in the community to bring people to Christ." It is exciting to be a part, not only of an individual congregation, but also a denomination that is seeking to do our part in fulfilling the great commission.

Deacon's Corner ~ Saying Thank You and Welcome

Lindsay Betz, one of the outgoing deacons, shares from her heart what this calling has meant to her. Also are some thoughts and thanks from our new moderator, Joan Ortlieb.

"I am sad to conclude my third year as a deacon, but during this experience I realized something interesting: many of the guidelines directed toward deacons are what God asks of each of us. We are to be a support for one another, and help meet one another's needs. We should pray for the sick, visit the lonely, and offer comfort to the grieving. God asks us to look after widows and orphans – those in need, and that is what deacons are asked to do as well.

It seems as though there is an assumption that being a deacon is overwhelming. It has been my experience that the more a deacon is connected with their parish, the more natural deaconing comes. Those monthly phone calls become conversations in person at church on Sundays, waving church friends down in grocery stores, or calling as a concerned friend instead of a deacon-on-duty when something goes wrong. Being a deacon is being a Christian with some extra connections and resources.

In a sense, being a deacon is more of a lifestyle instead of something we do. We shouldn't be checking phone calls off a list, although that is easy to do when a deacon hasn't connected with their parish. When we really reach out and connect with people, being a deacon is just being a Christian actively interested in loving other Christians. We can all do this."


MISSIONARY UPDATE JULY 2013


