Gathering Together for Worship

Happy March SSBC! I'm taking a break this month from my series on the healthy tensions of worship because I want to make a sincere plea to all of us for the month of March leading up to Easter.

SSBC is joining with Mt. Olivet Baptist to lead a night of worship *Celebrating the Jesus Difference*. We'll be leading the service two times, the first being on Sunday night, March 25, 6:00 p.m. at Mt. Olivet. The second will be on Good Friday night, 7:00 p.m. here at SSBC. Here is my list of pleas to each of us:

- 1. Pray all through March for God's Holy Spirit to invade these special worship celebrations.
- 2. Pray for God to lay at least one lost person upon your heart to invite to one of these worship times.
- 3. Invite the person(s) God lays on your heart.
- Plan to attend one, or better yet, both of these nights of worship. If you come to the first one, I guarantee you'll want to come back for the second.
- When you come, worship with complete abandonment. Sing. Praise. Pray. With all your might for the glory of Jesus.

The cross has vertical and horizontal beams. We are praying that these nights of worship point directly "vertical" to Jesus our Savior who reigns supremely in heaven above. - ☐ Take time to listen and learn about your classmates. Arrive a little early or stay a little late to listen and talk to them.

 When you are willing to sacrifice time to talk to someone, it lets them know that you have a sincere interest in them.
- ☐ Plan a social to invite friends to, where they are in a less threatening situation.
- ☐ Encourage your teacher and let them know that you are praying for them. If you feel led to, volunteer to teach one Sunday if your teacher has to be away. Let them know that you have a vested interest in what they are doing for your spiritual growth.
