When we meet again, we will compare our results and come up with a short list. At that point, we will begin to arrange initial interviews with that group of candidates. We will meet again on June 27th.

# a word from ryan

Imagine with me, for a minute, what our church with two professional full-time ordained ministers could be capable of. Now, remember: as with any exercise of the imagination, what we dream up is not necessarily what ends up happening, but it can encourage use to "dream big" so that we might lay good groundwork to make big things happen!

So, just imagine, new possibilities for Sunday mornings:

- Sunday mornings could more fully and richly meet the needs of many in our congregation. By having two ministers in worship, we each get to spend significant time developing our prayers, our liturgies, and our sermons. Worship is what we are all about, giving praise to God, and we can do that in new ways when you've got two folks working together to plan it each week.
- Both ministers get to spend time greeting and sharing with the guests and members of our church about their lives. By having two of us, we can talk to more people and make sure that more of their needs are met.
- Two ministers can simultaneously "relieve" each other during worship, meaning that one of us does not carry the bulk of a service alone. We can work to offer new and innovative preaching series, each offering a unique and different voice.
- On Sundays, the possibility exists that one minister might be able to lead worship alone one morning while the other goes upstairs to lead worship for our children in their Children Worship and Wonder center.

Just imagine, new possibilities for Christian education:

- As our worship becomes more full, we look for opportunities to sustain our congregation through vital and relevant Christian Education. This could mean that I and another minister lead a Sunday School hour for young families and their children, respectively. It could mean that we work together to develop new opportunities for intergenerational Sunday School that brings together all of our people to share in their perspectives together.
- What about better using Wednesday nights? We already have choir rehearsal and youth group on Wednesday evenings. What if we began to offer a meal in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesday evenings that was followed by Youth Group, Choir practice, Childcare possibilities, and new opportunities for Adult Continued Learning?
- The possibility exists for Ryan to flex his spiritual gift of writing more, and offering the congregation with "take-home" study resources for the weekly

GRIP readings about the Bible.

Just imagine, new possibilities for Pastoral Care:

- What if we were able to offer a visit to each one of our members who is homebound or in a nursing care facility not twice a month (like we are right now), but once a week?
- With two pastors on staff, each minister can take different "days off," meaning that there is a minister always available on any given day for pastoral counseling, guidance, and spiritual direction.
- When a family finds itself in crisis, they can receive the pastoral care and support of not just one minister, but two. One minister can be a pastoral presence to the family, while the other coordinates the compassionate response of our congregation.

Just imagine the new possibilities for Mission and Outreach:

- each summer our Youth and our Adults playfully rival each other as they prepare to go on weeklong mission trips to different parts of the country and possibly even the world. We grow and develop lasting relationships with people in other parts of the country and world so that our congregation might grow from our bonds of Christian love with these folks.
- We can expand the outreach work we do with the community because now two ministers can share the responsibility of being present to the many different active parts of Smithville.
- Another minister can hold the work I've started to revive the Smithville Community Clergy connections accountable, and we can find a renewed push in working with our faithful sisters and brothers from other churches.

These are just a few possibilities. Can you imagine more? I encourage you to send them along to me via email or a note on my desk about what you dream a new minister can help us to do.

In two weeks, we'll continue this series about the new possibilities and challenges of our new minister by turning to the impact that this new minister will have on our stewardship.
