I ask you to join me in celebrating this and in praying for the future ministry of this congregation.

In the coming weeks Renovate, a second site of First UMC in Sikeston will launch. This new Christian community has a vision of serving unreached millennials with the life changing message of God's love and grace made known in and through Jesus. Again, I ask that you join me in praying for our fellow servants, lay and clergy, who are leading this new ministry endeavor.

I'm filled with gratitude for the unique privilege of being in Christ's service with you. To use the well-known prayer of Dag Hammarskjöld: "For all that has been 'Thank You.' For all that is to come, 'Yes!"
