ROOM IN THE INN

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! To all of our Southern Hills and Christ Church UMC families for successfully helping us through our 12th year of

assisting many of Lexington's homeless men from December through mid-March by providing warm, comfortable shelter, delicious meals, meaningful fellowship, and financial support as part of a community-wide mission with 23 other area churches.

You drove to the church in very cold, sometimes snowy weather to inflate mattresses and make up beds, cook and serve dinner, prepare hot breakfasts, and assemble sack lunches for 14 men each week, while also running to the store or back home if we had run out of something we needed that night. You cleaned up after dinner, drove the church bus to pick up our guests and deliver them back to downtown Lexington on Sunday, accompanied them to services at The Source, spent the night as overnight hosts, disassembled mattresses, ran the vacuum, cleaned the restroom, washed mattress pads, and even bagged up the sheets, blankets, and towels for pick-up by a commercial laundry in Lexington.

During this 2015-2016 season, approximately 320 SH and CC members volunteered in one capacity or in many areas working individually, in small groups, larger groups, multi-generational families, scout troops, circles, and choirs to help to maintain stability in the lives of over 165 homeless men during the 14 Saturday nights our Room in the Inn was open.

It certainly does take a village to make this RITI program successful! We're grateful to all of you for giving of your own time and resources and appreciate what you have helped our church accomplish this year in supporting such a worthwhile, community outreach program.
