In the records of the Franklin County, Virginia Court House there is the will of a man who owned slaves. In the will he listed the value of each slave. One was valued at \$200. The name of the slave was Booker T. Washington, destined to be a great scientist and founder of the renowned Tuskegee Institute.

What are you worth? Melted down and packaged in the right way, probably two to five dollars depending on the inflation rate. You are made up of enough sugar to sweeten a glass of tea, enough salt to sprinkle on a fried egg, enough iron to make a small nail, enough sulfur to chase your dog's fleas away and enough lime to whitewash a tree house.

But is that you? Are you just a package of chemicals or is there more to you than that? The actions of God in Christ say there is much, much more.

We know of His willingness to become involved with us because of the manger at Bethlehem. When Jesus was born of Mary, he "emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in the likeness of men" Philippians 2:7 (RSV). We know of his ability to overcome sin and death and about his love and forgiveness, because of the Cross- and beyond that, the Empty tomb. "And being found in human form he humbled himself and became obedient unto death, even death on a cross" Philippians 2:9 (RSV).

The awesome truth is that we are not only "fearfully and wonderfully made", but that none of us is here by accident. God loves us and desires fellowship with us. The Psalmist David marvels, "what is man that thou art mindful of him, and the son of man that thou dost care for him? Yet thou hast made him little less than God..." Psalm 8:4-5 (RSV).

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you! We cannot say that enough to the members of our Southern Hills United Methodist Church family who have successfully helped us through our 10th year of

assisting many of Lexington's homeless men on Saturday nights from December - March by providing warm, comfortable shelter, delicious meals, meaningful fellowship, and financial support as part of a community-wide mission with 23 other churches.

You drove in the worst kind of weather, assembled and made up the beds, cooked dinners, served meals, fixed sack lunches, prepared breakfasts, cleaned up after dinner, drove the bus to pick up the men and drop them off early on Sunday morning, ran out to the grocery or to your homes when we ran out of supplies, spent the night and then cleaned the area after the men had left, offered to take the men to church on Sunday, and even washed the beds' mattress pads. I'm sure we have missed some of the other things that you did for our men at Room in the Inn for the winter's four coldest months.

During the 2013-2014 season, approximately 275 people volunteered in one capacity or another (individuals, small groups, larger groups, multigenerational families, scout troops, circles, and mens' groups, for set-up, laundry, overnight hosts, and transportation while preparing and serving home-cooked meals (dinner, breakfast, and lunch) for more than 240 individuals on the first, second, and fourth Saturday evenings from December- March.

It does seem to take a village to make programs successful! We could never have coordinated this special community service project if it hadn't been for each of you who provided much-needed support and so freely gave of your own time and resources. Please pat yourself on the back and know that we are so grateful to each of you and appreciate what you have helped our church accomplish this year for Room in the Inn!

PHASE 2 OF THE VISION PATHWAY PROCESS TO BEGIN IN AUGUST

Eight months ago, our church embarked on a Vision Clarity Journey. The Vision Pathway Team has sought to assess and consider hopes and dreams for the future of Southern Hills. There are four tasks that the team has been working on: to Rethink Vision, Uncover Uniqueness, Talk Up Vision, and Live Out Vision. This process is based on a book called Church Unique, by Will Mancini. On June 2, this Vision Pathway Team will complete their work.

Over the next few weeks, Vision Pathway Team reports will be presented in the newsletter, in church services, and at official meetings of the church. It is clear, however, that this is only the first phase of the process, and that a second phase is in order to implement new findings and recommendations. Therefore, by the end of August, a new team will be constituted of both former and new persons of the Vision Pathway Team and begin to meet monthly. In order to reach out to a wide representation of our church, interested church members will be invited to make application to join the new Phase 2 team. These applications will be available at the Welcome Center at the church main entrance.

The chosen process for Phase 2 is facilitated by Spiritual Leadership Incorporated (SLI). It is the preferred visioning tool for 52 Annual Conferences in the U.S., including the Kentucky Conference. SLI and their staff have been made available to our church though the financial support of the Lexington District. Please prayerfully consider your participation in Phase 2 of our Vision Pathway Team!

Reduce Your Risk



With June will also come the need for protection from UV rays from the sun. UV rays from sunlight are the greatest during late spring and early summer. During the past years doctors have become more aware of the increase in skin cancer in the United States and have determined that all people need to protect themselves to prevent such issues as: Skin Cancer – Premature Aging of the Skin – Damage to Eyes (sometimes blinding) as well as many medical conditions that can be made worse by UV exposure.

The CDC recommends the below options for protection from these rays –

- Stay in the shade during midday hours (9am to 3pm standard time are the most hazardous)
- Wear light clothing that covers your arms and legs
- Wear a hat with a wide brim to shade your face, head, ears and neck
- Wear sunglasses that wrap around and block both UVA and UVB rays
- Use sunscreen with protective factor (SPF 15 or higher and both UVA and UVB protection)
- ♦ Avoid indoor tanning


