"We Will Give Our Attention To..."

There is a story of two camels (father and son) talking together. "Poppa, why do we have such long eyebrows?" "Son, the reason for the long eyebrows is to help keep the hot sand out of our eyes." "Poppa, why do we have such large hoofs?" "Son, the reason we have large hoofs is to keep us from sinking into the sand as we cross the hot desert." "Poppa, if we were made for the hot deserts, then what are we doing in this zoo?"

My question is "Are we doing what we have been created for?" In Acts 6 there was some grumbling among the folks; it seems that some of the widows were being overlooked in the distribution of food. The Apostles listened, and then acted – seemingly without hesitation. "It would not be

good for us to neglect the ministry of the Word of God in order to wait on tables. Brothers choose seven men from among you who are known to be full of the Spirit and wisdom. We will turn this responsibility over to them..."

I like that passage, but I even like the next phrase better. And we "...will give our attention to prayer and the ministry of the word." There are a couple of interesting conclusions from this intentional discipline: "This proposal pleased the whole group." Then a few verses later, Luke adds, "So the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly, and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith." I have not seen nor witnessed too many actions that pleased a whole group, so I am still in search of that miracle! But a result of this intentional focus there was another great movement, "the word of God spread. The number of disciples in Jerusalem increased rapidly..." And yet there is another miracle here, or did you miss it like I did? "...and a large number of priests became obedient to the faith."

Prayer is definitely a spiritual discipline, and certainly a major part of discipleship. And the story of Acts 6 certainly convicts me to give <u>more</u> "attention to prayer and the ministry of the word." Yet, I

caution myself not to lay this burden on all believers around me. I totally believe that we all ought to pray. Prayer is certainly biblical, it is modeled, and it is necessary. However, I wonder if at times we make everyone responsible for giving more and more "attention to prayer and the ministry of the word" and forget the balance of the body that Christ has formed. Some are called to wait on tables (by the way, waiting on tables is a great ministry, if I may say so – they must be full of faith and the Holy Spirit!). Some are called to devote themselves to prayer and others are called to minister to the needs of those around them.

When the individual members of the body give attention to what they are called to do, we will *not* be asking the question, "What are we doing in this zoo?" Instead the church will be hoofing it across the hot sands of the desert and many will be added to Christ's kingdom and even those who are "religious" may indeed become obedient to the faith.

So, what are you giving your attention to?

Read Ephesians 4:11-16

I believe God is yearning to breathe new life into this established church in Ephesians and even in your local church. The question is – are we going to let him do that. As I read this passage of scripture I see that Paul is really trying to help this church see that God wants to do something great in their church but they have to be willing to let God do some things in them. If you look all through scripture, God never used highfalutin, prideful people. He used down-to-earth people, ordinary people to be part of the ministry. I see that we are ordinary, down-to-earth people and God wants to use all of us in some way in ministry. Paul says in verse 11: "God gives some to be apostles, some to be prophets, some evangelist, some to be pastors and teachers." Those who have been called to do this are not to do all the work in the church. Those ones that I spoke of are to train and teach people to do the work so that the body of Christ may be built up. It says in verse 13, "Until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the son of God and become mature attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." Paul is talking about the church coming to a place of unity so they can be built up in the faith. I hope you see how important that is. It's crucial for the body to be united in Christ together. We need that today in the church. That's why Paul says: "Prepare the people, Gods people for work of the service so the body of Christ may be built up in Him." Paul wanted the church to come to that faith and knowledge of the Son of God. He knew if they did that, they would become mature in their faith and experience the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. When we come to that point spiritually, we can start to fulfill the service that God wants us to fulfill. I felt lead to share this with you because this is Gods desire for His church to be united in Christ, becoming mature in Christ, and experiencing the full measure of Christ. If there isn't unity, maturity, and a fullness of Christ in us, we will not fit well into the body of Christ. Let's be who Christ has called us to be, people who are united in Christ, people who are willing to use their gifts and talents for Christ. God wants to use you in your local church to build his kingdom. Let him be the Head of the church so he can lead you.



Over the past three years, more than 400 Nazarene congregations around the world have participated in Freedom Sunday, a day set aside for prayer, worship, and support around the crisis of human trafficking, which enslaves as many as 45.8 million people globally, according to the 2016 Global Slavery Index.

This year, Nazarene churches are encouraged to participate in Freedom Sunday on September 24, 2017, the last Sunday of that month.

The Church of the Nazarene's participation in Freedom Sunday began in 2014 in coordination with other denominations within the Wesleyan Holiness Connection (formerly Wesleyan Holiness Consortium). That same year, the Church of the Nazarene's Board of General Superintendents endorsed the Declaration for Freedom, a document drafted by the Wesleyan-Holiness leaders, including Nazarene representatives.

In the past, Freedom Sunday took place on the first Sunday of Lent. This year, the event was moved to the last Sunday of September to enable churches that plan traditional Lenten services to participate.

Congregations are encouraged to plan a Freedom Sunday at any time that works in their calendar. Freedom Sunday planning resources are available as free downloads through Nazarene Compassionate Ministries at ncm.org/freedomsunday.
