# 2017 CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

In 2008, during the height of the economic downturn, South Mecklenburg Presbyterian Church boldly began raising the funds to construct our current Sanctuary home. It was a difficult time to take such a leap of faith. Through prayer and generous giving, we now have our enduring worship space, which has given us room to welcome many more families to our faith community. During the subsequent years, we as a congregation have committed to several capital campaigns and have substantially reduced the debt we owe to \$4.1 million.

During the coming weeks, SMPC will embark on a new capital campaign to raise at least \$1.4 million to meet the required debt payments over the coming three years. A leadership team has been commissioned to this important endeavor. The leadership team, along with Hewett Consulting and many of you, will work hand in hand and in a spirit of generosity to ensure success. Here are several important opportunities where we will ask for your engagement:

# Come Read the Story!

"You tell a story because a statement would be inadequate. When anybody asks what a story is about, the only proper thing is to tell him to read the story."

- Flannery O'Connor

Luke is, perhaps, the most gifted storyteller of all the Gospel writers. He tells an incredibly engaging story of the life of Jesus. Many of us remember one of the many parables of Jesus that are exclusive to this book of the Bible: the Prodigal Son, the Good Samaritan, and more. Luke uses Jesus' parables and the story of his life to paint a picture for us of what the life of a follower of Christ really looks like: what does it mean for me to be a person of faith under the rule of God? We can think of no better time to ask this question than during the season of Lent, and this year we're inviting you to read the Gospel of Luke with us, to examine this question, and to emerge on Easter as people who are living into the grace of God through Jesus Christ.

How will we do it? There are a few different parts to the reading of Luke. First, you are invited to pick up a bookmark and use it to read short passages from Luke on each day of Lent. You can also read these daily passages by subscribing to them online. Second, on Sundays, we will choose one story from our weekly readings with which to engage. The sermon will focus on the passage, and children and adults will be invited to study it more fully in Sunday School. Matt's Bible studies on Wednesday will offer a chance to review the text, and our Lenten Yoga will be yet another opportunity to reflect on the reading from Luke.

So, come with us! As Alan Culpepper writes, "If the Spirit empowered the witness of this Gospel, then by opening ourselves to it we may also be guided by God's Spirit to be a part of God's ongoing redemptive work." Let's take some wisdom from Flannery O'Connor and read the story!


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#### SPIRITUAL JOURNALING FOR LENT

Tuesday, February 28


Serving begins at 5:30 p.m., Mecklenburg Hall

Sundays, March 5 - April 9


