



If you are interested in learning more about your faith through the scriptures, then come join us, the “Adult Bible Study” Sunday school class, each Sunday at 9:45 in Room 106. We cover the scriptures multiple ways: Sometimes chapter by chapter as we did when studying Hebrews; following a theme, we studied Paul’s life and letters for over a year; sometimes we use other authors like Adam Hamilton’s Lenten (*24 Hours that Changed the World*) and Advent (*The Journey*) studies; or we might spend several weeks on special studies as we did on the Lord’s Prayer and the Ten Commandments. Lessons are taught through mostly lecture, aided sometimes by music, video, and discussion. Take a test drive of one of our lessons by downloading it from the Church web site in the Media section. But most of all come join us. We’re more than an adult Sunday school; we’re a family of believers looking out for each other. We’d love you to have you visit, and hopefully you’ll stay and be part of who we are.

Paul said to Timothy that *“All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching the truth...so that the person who serves God may be fully qualified and equipped to do every kind of good deed. (2 Timothy 3:16)*

### **Adult Calendar:**

June 2016 – Feb 2017: John – The author of the Gospel of John says he wrote the book for two reasons: To provide evidence why we should believe that Jesus is the Christ, and to show that Jesus is the Son of God, so we might have life believing in His name. John is different from the other Gospels. Come with us as our class does an in-depth study of the fourth Gospel, written by one of His closest disciples. We will use various sources, including Adam Hamilton’s study *John: The Gospel of Light and Life*.

Mar 2017 – Dec 2017: Samuel to Kings – The “Deuteronomist history” of Israel includes the seven Old Testament books of Deuteronomy through Second Kings. The writers used the core of laws in Deuteronomy to explain Israel’s history and to judge Israel’s kings and Israel’s people. These writers explained that Israel’s abandonment of faith in the Lord led to the downfall of the monarchy and exile of its people. Our study of Samuel and Kings will cover the period from Israel’s last judge, through the establishment of the monarchy and the story of Israel’s kings, to the people of Israel in exile in Babylon about 586 BC. Come join us as we study the historical books of the Old Testament.
