Our Trip to Kenya

Holly and I have just returned from a mission trip with SOMA (Sharing of Ministries Abroad), an Anglican missions agency that provides leadership training and renewal conferences to dioceses around the world. We had the pleasure of working closely with The Rev. Steve and Karen Capper, who once served at St. Clement's and now works for Mission Houston.

Our ministry to the Anglican Diocese of Mombasa included teaching and ministering in parishes, a Theological Institute, and gatherings of both Anglican and non-Anglican clergy. We also met with Bishop Julius and other diocesan officials. The diocese faces many huge challenges, including widespread poverty, AIDS and very aggressive Islamic proselytizing.

We saw God's Holy Spirit at work as we taught, prayed for and counseled with various groups and individuals. Of course, you have probably heard about the difficulty of traveling through Europe, and it was by God's grace that we were able to return as soon as we did. Thank you for your prayers. We felt covered by them! Holly and I feel very privileged to have been able to go on this trip. We look forward to sharing with you more specifically the things that God did, and the insights He gave us on this amazing adventure.

In addition, while it may be a bit belated to say so, I thought that the Presence of the Risen Christ was most powerful in the Holy Week and Easter services at St. Clement's! I don't know how someone could possibly attend one of these worship services and not encounter our Lord! Thanks to all those who worked so hard to make it all happen so smoothly.

As you are probably well aware, the economic recession has resulted in lower giving to Christian churches and missions agencies, as well as other non-profit organizations. The vestry of St. Clement's has sought to be good stewards of the money that you give to the mission and ministry of this church. We have held our normal expenses in check very well, but at the same time, our health care insurance increased this year by \$23,000 and we have had to address long term capital projects, including maintenance on the organ and the replacement of old kitchen equipment.


Our giving is currently down \$29,000 to budget at the end of the first quarter. In light of this, please prayerfully consider your giving to the work of this amazing church.

Ciudad Nueva Community Outreach seeks to embody the gospel of Jesus Christ by advancing the renewal and development of inner city El Paso through the transformation and empowerment of its residents.



ARE YOU ABLE TO HELP A NEIGHBORHOOD YOUTH ATTEND SUMMER CAMP???

Once again, we are planning to provide scholarships for neighborhood youth to attend Christian summer adventure camps in New Mexico and Arizona, as well as day camps here in town.



This year our goal is to provide scholarships for over 60 kids to attend camp!!!

In the past, camp attendance has been **one of the most transformational weeks** in the lives of the kids. Camp provides a chance for these kids to head to the mountains (sometimes for the first time ever), expand their vision, grow in faith, and build deeper relationships. In order to provide this amazing experience we need to raise **well over \$20,000** to provide scholarships for **40 kids to attend out-of-town camps and another 20+ kids to attend 5 weeks of day camps in town**. The scholarships cover the cost of the camp, transportation/food, a photo & t-shirt from camp, a small allowance for the camp store, and a few basic camping accessories. In order to earn these scholarships, kids must be regular participants in our after-school ministry, exhibit good behavior,

pay a very small fee, and complete **community service activities**. Some of the kids in Launch Pad have been saving up their Launch Pad "bucks" for three years in order to attend camp!

The total cost for most of the camps ranges from \$350 to \$500 per camper, depending on the camp. 
