Then we listen and respond to the scriptures in which the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ is proclaimed as the promise of new life. Finally, we take our leave of the one we love as their last earthly journey to a place of rest begins. We leave them in God's care as we continue our own life's journey trusting in the goodness of God.

Standing and weeping beside the grave of his friend Lazarus, Jesus said,

"I am the resurrection and the life," says the Lord. "Those who believe in me, even though they die, yet will they live."

FUNERAL SERVICE

Church Service

The service is conducted by the Vicar or other clergy and follows Anglican customs.

The Holy Eucharist may be celebrated if requested. This is especially suitable when someone has been an active member of the Church. The Vicar will consult with the family to select the readings and prayers as well as music and hymns if included.

Members of the family will be invited to take part in the service if that is their wish. When arrangements are finalised an Order of Service is prepared and printed.

Music

Music can be provided by an organist. Selection of suitable music and hymns (optional) is arranged in consultation with the Vicar.

Flowers

Fresh flowers are arranged in the Church each week by members of the parish. If extra flowers are required this can be arranged at an additional cost.

Hall or Room Hire for Refreshments

Refreshments may be served in the St George's Centre beside the Church following the service. Suitable caterers can be recommended. Arrangements for hire are made through the Parish Office in consultation with the clergy.

Memorial Garden & Book

A beautiful and peaceful memorial garden is maintained at the side of the church. Interment of the ashes of the deceased in the garden can be arranged. In addition, names of those whose ashes are in the garden are inscribed in the Memorial Book. The departed are remembered in services each year at the anniversary of death. In this way the departed are called to mind within a living community of prayer.
