A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah

The prophet looks to a time when Israel, given a new name and mission, will be the cause of the nations seeing the glory of God and knowing that those who chose God's ways will be shown to be right.

I will greatly rejoice in the LORD,

**Psalm Song of Mary (Magnificat) at 8am APBA, page 388,

Mary responds to the good news that God is now acting decisively through the promise to Israel with this song. Anglicans still best know it as the Magnificat from the first word in the Latin version Magnificat anima mea dominum My soul glorifies God. Mary sings of a world in which the present unjust way of things is overturned by God's purposes now being accomplished.



Mary visits Elizabeth: God's purposes and plans are entrusted to two women considered of no real account and revealed first in an intimate moment between them.

A reading from the letter to the Galatians

Some teachers in Galatia had claimed that a Christian must first embrace Judaism, observing Mosaic law. Paul wrote this letter to rebut this argument, to insist that a person comes into union with God through faith in Christ. Ritual actions support that faith, but cannot be a substitute.

And because you are children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' So you are no longer a slave but a child, and if a child then also an heir, through God.

Reader A reading from the holy gospel according to St Luke

God's messenger was sent to the tiny village of Nazareth, to Mary, a young woman engaged to Joseph. Joseph is descended from David and this child, whose conception is announced, will occupy "the throne of his ancestor David" and "of his kingdom there will be no end". This is the work of the Spirit. Mary has conceived through God's loving and now to be embodied engagement in human affairs, and not by Joseph.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.
