October 4<sup>th</sup> is the feast day of St. Francis, one of my favorite saints. We will have our 3<sup>rd</sup> annual Blessing of the Animals on October 14<sup>th</sup> in honor of St. Francis. He is beloved and revered for his attitude toward nature and animals, believing that all of creation is good and beautiful, and that all of creation (humans, animals, rocks and hills) is called to praise God. The core of St. Francis' ministry goes deeper than just a reverence for creation. It dwells in the heart of service and love that God gives to each one of us. St. Francis was born into a wealthy merchant family but gave away all that he had and lived a joyful life in extreme poverty and serving the poor.
