My dear friends,

May is often a month of beginnings and endings. Winter is (finally!) ending and spring brings warmth, longer days and blossoms. The graduations and weddings that are often celebrated this month are portals to leave an old way of life and greet the future. May also brings us the Ascension of Jesus and the Day of Pentecost. These are certainly days when we are reminded that we are called into the future with the love of Christ and the strength of the Holy Spirit. I can imagine that the Disciples would have been very glad if Jesus had just simply stayed with them—not just for those fifty days after the resurrection, but for the whole length of their lives. But Jesus did ascend and he is with all people everywhere across space and time, and not just with those few who were blessed to walk with him two thousand years ago.

Change—even hoped-for, positive change—can be frightening and upsetting. We've all experienced the flutter of spirits that goes along with leaving, moving, graduating or progressing. We leave behind an old way—perhaps a comfortable, beloved old way—to embrace the future. So before Jesus leaves the disciples he says "Don't let your hearts be troubled." Because he knows they will be. They, like us, are human and often fear change and loss. He tells the disciples that the Holy Spirit will be with them, to guide and to strengthen them. Other names for the Holy Spirit are Paraclete, Advocate, Comforter, Indweller, Witness, Teacher and Helper. Pentecost reminds us that we are never left alone. God's Holy Spirit is among us and within us working wonders through us.

St. James Vestry

The Vestry is the legal representatives and agents of our parish, and they share leadership responsibilities with the Rector. St. James is like a business in that we have to pay attention to bills, taxes, legal requirements and so on. However, we are first and foremost the Body of Christ. Our Wardens and vestry members have been elected and entrusted by the people of St. James with a sacred responsibility to lead and guide with **both** an eye to our systems, buildings and finances **and** a heart toward prayer, spiritual growth and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. Remember our parish leaders in your daily prayers. Ask God to give them the grace to lead as Christ would have us lead.

Vestry Meetings

- o Are held on the third Tuesday of every month at 7 p.m. in the Guild Room.
- Are open to all parishioners. Visitors to vestry meetings are asked to keep silent during the meeting, unless they are invited into the discussion by the Rector or Wardens.
- Occasionally it is necessary for the Vestry to go into "Executive Session" to discuss highly confidential or sensitive subjects. In this rare circumstance all visitors will be asked to leave the room for the duration of the Executive Session period, and then will be invited back.

Rector-Warden's Meetings

 Are held every week (usually Thursdays at 2 pm) to discuss new and on-going issues that concern all aspects of St. James life.

Vestry Discussion Topics

- May be submitted by any parishioner.
- If you would like a topic to be considered for the next meeting, get that item to the Rector or a Warden no later than 2 pm on the 1st Thursday of the month, for that month's Vestry meeting.
- In cases of emergency or when timeliness is vital, this deadline will be relaxed, but please, only in cases of real emergency!

• Reports to the Vestry

 All reports for that month's meeting should be submitted to the Rector or to the Office by the 2nd Tuesday of the month. (ECW will have an additional day to submit their report so that it can reflect their meeting of the 2nd Tuesday.)

Genesee County CASA for Children,
Crossroads House, Le Roy Christian Community Project and
Volunteers for Animals.

Fish Fry Report

I am pleased to report that we have had a very successful fish fry season. After all of the bills have been paid we have netted just over \$13,000. Here are some more facts you may find interesting:

- 1. We prepared over 1,950 pieces of fish and 70 Macaroni and Cheese meals for a total of over 2,000 meals.
- 2. We sold almost 1,000 pieces of dessert.
- 3. We delivered 346 meals to the community.
- 4. We served just over 800 people in the dining room and another 800 meals were carried out the door.
- 5. We served over 1,100 baked potatoes.

Not too many years in the past we were excited if we served 100 meals on a given night. Our average now is about 330 a night. Consequently, this project has outgrown our ability to serve the community by ourselves. We are very pleased to welcome St. Paul and St. Mark churches as our partners. The help we received from them filled in spots where we were short-handed. We look forward to working with them again in the future.
