GREAT THINGS GROW FROM SMALL BEGINNINGS

Bringing the Gospel Home: Thoughts for Parents

The Gospel passage for today (Luke 17:5-10) can be frustrating. We could think that Jesus is chastising us, saying that if we had even the tiniest bit of faith we would have super powers. Have you ever been able to talk to a tree and tell it to move? Move into the sea? Nope, not me. I don't think that's the message that Jesus wants to send. It might help to talk about this parable in the context of Luke 13. In that story Jesus reminds us that the tiny seed grows into a large tree that is beautify, useful and gives food and shelter.

Children know that they will grow, and as they grow they will gain strength and abilities, just as the tree grows. However, today's parable is not about waiting until we are "big enough". It's about doing what we can, and doing it now. That our actions—like our faith—will grow, expand and take on new beauty and impact. Even the smallest child can do good things NOW by helping, loving, sharing, and giving.

Children often feel little and "not enough." Jesus says to them that they are "enough"—just as **the tiny mustard seed is enough.** Urge them to live as Jesus' disciple where ever they are and whatever they are doing. They can do it. They are big enough!
