A message from the Wardens

This is a set-back, but will not change the final outcome. We will call "The Right Rector" for SJOTM.

The Discernment Committee has done a wonderful job. deeply grateful to: Janette Carlucci, Mikael Salovaara, Jody Flegal, Chip Baird, Anne Kearns, Sandy Putnam, and Constance Silverman. Special kudos goes to Peter Mercer for his gentle thoughtful yet persistent and organized approach. We know this has not been an easy task, but we are sure that they have done it prayerfully and that God will guide them, and us, to the right decision.

The Vestry has asked the Discernment Committee to bring back to it for consideration two or three more of the existing candidates. This should not take too long and we have set the goal of making the call by the end of July at the latest. We are all anxious to complete this process; please continue in patience and prayer.

Pray that we may soon find "The Right Rector" for St John on the Mountain.

Once that most important calling is made and accepted, and the negotiations completed, we will move as quickly as we can to hiring a new Director of Music.

Yes, many things are changing at St John on the Mountain, and change can be unsettling. But change also presents opportunities for growth and we look forward to that growth, and to the unfolding of new spiritual dimensions at our beloved Church.

Over the next two months we will celebrate both new staff and From now until Mother Melissa leaves us, we will thank her formally and informally and, eventually, wish her God Speed in her new role. She has served us ably and graciously in the name of God.

María Carluccí's Sermon from Youth Sunday - May 22, 2011

Jesus said to John and his disciples, "I am the way, the truth, and the life". That is a very certain, undisputed statement. 

Grace Soup Kitchen


We will work at Grace's Soup Kitchen on Friday, July 29th at 10:00am. A sign-up sheet is located on the bulletin board near Parish Hall.


