The Rev. Tom Brackett, Head of Missional Initiatives for the Episcopal Church and Keynote Speaker at Diocesan Convention this year, reflected with us on what it means to be God's Beloveds, and he spoke extensively on the baptism of Jesus, when God declared to Jesus, "You are mine. The Beloved." Or, in another translation Brackett used, "God declared to Jesus, 'You're it!'"

It's what God declares at every baptism, "You're mine. You're it!"

It is the first year since I have come as Rector when we are not preparing someone for an Easter baptism. In recent years, our community has gathered at the Great Vigil of Easter to behold as Mason, Melissa, Alan, Lily, and Whitney were claimed forever in the waters of baptism. To the best of my knowledge, we do not have anyone among us who desires baptism right now. I have been pondering what this means for us, we who have begun our Lenten season together and are steadily approaching our High Holy Days.

I think it means that we are all supposed to be drenched



this year. Each of us. All of us together. We, who have been baptized, are being called to return to the watery home of our birth, where we can feel and know again what we so often forget, that God has called us God's Beloveds. We can't very well convince others that this is true, unless we truly believe it for ourselves, that God beholds each of us and declares, "You are my Beloved. You are it!"

In these weeks of Lent we will prepare again to renew the promises of baptism, and prepare to get wet again. We may not have a baby to gather around and soak in the life-giving water, but we can remind each other.

You are the Beloved. You're it. I'm it. We're it.


MEN'S LUNCHEON


