WHAT DOES AN USHER DO?

We love our Ushers at SJOTM! They perform a valuable part of our 10 am worship service each Sunday. Anyone from age 12 to 112 can be an Usher - there is no age limit! The ushers are the first to greet the worshipers as they enter the church. They hand out bulletins, count the number of worshipers and records that number on the usher envelope. The offering is collected and placed the the usher envelope. After the service, the usher greets people as they depart or directs them to coffee hour. It's really that simple!

If you think that you want to give ushering a try, contact the office. You will be assigned a Sunday to usher with a "veteran" to show you the ropes. Being an Usher is a great way to meet members of our community and it's an easy way to participate in our worship. Most ushers perform this ministry only once a month - and you can pick the Sunday you wish to Usher!


Our youngest volunteers harvesting some jumbo pole beans. Almost 50 pounds of fresh produce to area food pantries this week!
