Season of Lent Continues

We will offer our last Midweek Lenten Soup Supper and Wednesday Worship Service on Wednesday, April 5th! I want to express my sincere words of thanks to Dave Boie, Erin Lappen, Morgan Diers and Dan Berg for sharing at our first four Lenten Services. We look forward to hearing from Carrie Pilgrim on April 5th! We will then move into Holy Week, the very heart of our faith as Christians! The Holy Week services are some of the most visual services of the year. As I look back over my own childhood, it is the Holy Week services that stand out to me as my most memorable worship experiences. I certainly hope and pray that you will make every effort to participate in these services - and if you are parents of children and youth, that you will make it a priority to share these worship experiences with your children.

<u>Easter</u>

On Sunday, April 16th, we will gather to celebrate, with Christians around the world, the resurrection of our crucified Savior, Jesus the Christ. We will share the ancient greeting: "Christ is risen!" To which others will respond, "Christ is risen, indeed!" We will again speak the "Alleluia" and we will raise our voices in joyous songs of praise! For Easter means that God has vindicated Jesus, that in raising Jesus from the tomb, God has put God's stamp of approval on the life that Jesus lived – and the life that Jesus called us to live! The life of service and love, the life of justice and peace, the life of forgiveness and grace is the life abundant that Jesus promised --- and it's God's dream for God's world! Easter reminds us that we are "Easter people" --- we are people who, by God's grace, have been raised to new life – so that we might be God's transformative people in our world! So join us as we gather to celebrate anew the good news of Easter on April 16th. But please remember that Easter is not just a day --- it's a season (running from April 16th through May 3rd) --- and not only is it a season, but we worship on Sundays because every Sunday is to be a celebration of Easter throughout the entire year!!!!

This year, as was decided by our Worship and Music Team, we will be celebrating Holy Communion on EACH Sunday throughout the Easter season!

Food for Kidz

Enclosed in this month's newsletter is a special offering envelope. I am asking you to consider a gift, above and beyond your regular giving, to help pay for the food that we will package with Food for Kidz on April 26th! This has been a congregational ministry effort (lead by our youth) for many years – long before I arrived. It's a great "hands-on" opportunity for youth and adults of St. John's to DO SOMETHING to care for the hungry in our community (some of the food will be given to our food shelf), within our country, and around the world! But

here's the thing – we can only package what we can pay for – so we need your generosity! The D-Way youth have been giving an offering every Wednesday towards this end – but they need your GENEROUS HELP! It costs .15 per meal. So that means a gift of \$20 would provide over 133 meals, a gift of \$50 would provide over 333 meals, a gift of \$100 would provide over 566 meals, and a gift of \$1000 would provide over 5666 meals. Just think of the difference such means will make in feeding the hungry children and adults of our world! Please give so that others might live! And come and join in the fun of working together to package these meals!

As the minutes reflect, we will be posting this externally as a "full-time" position, but we will also, at the same time, be posting it locally as either a full or part-time position. The reasoning behind this is that we want to be open to the possibility that there might be 2 or 3 people in our area who are looking for a part-time position who would be willing to oversee one part of the CYF program (e.g. elementary ministries, or middle school ministries, or high school ministries, or some other combination). The direction we would take would be determined by the applications received, and by what helps us to best move our CYF Ministries forward. This year's SW MN Synod Assembly will be held Friday, June 9th and Saturday, June 10th at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter. I WOULD LOVE TO SHARE THIS EXPERIENCE WITH FIVE MEMBERS OF ST. JOHN'S! Yes, in addition to us as pastors, we can bring five voting members! This is a great opportunity to get a sense of our larger church, what we are doing together, and what God is up to in our world! If you are interested, or would like more information, please give me a call. We would like to register BEFORE May 19th so that we get in on the early-bird discount! The theme of the assembly this year is "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age" based on Matthew 28:20! I guarantee that you will come away from the gathering feeling proud to be part of the ELCA and the work that we are doing together in Jesus' name!

Recently, while watching a video, I was convicted by the comments of a woman from Tunisia – a country in northern Africa. In the video she shared a whole list of things that she knew about our country and then challenged us to use the internet more productively and to learn about her country and others. I was convicted of the fact that I know very little about the rest of the world. So, I have begun learning something about one country each and every day. There are 195 countries in our world (196 if you include Taiwan) – so it should take me a little over half a year to accomplish. At the time of my writing this article – I am three days into my challenge. So far, this is a little of what I have learned:

- Afghanistan: It is one of the poorest countries in our world 42% of the people live on less than \$1 a day. As a result, the average life expectancy of both men and women is 60 years.
- <u>Albania</u>: Located to the north of Greece. The home country of Mother Theresa. 50% of their population is under 30 years old. It was the home of one of the lst universities in Europe. On average, 300 days a year are SUNNY!

Algeria: Located in North Africa – it is the largest country (land size) in Africa – four times the size of Texas; but the Sahara Desert covers 80% of its land. Algeria is the home country of St. Augustine of Hippo who lived 354-430 and was a very influential voice in the Christian faith. Women in Algeria have more independence than women in other Islamic countries. In Algeria, women often make the larger portion of household income. Women comprise 60% of all judges, 70% of all lawyers, and 60% of the student population.

Don't worry, next month's newsletter will not include 30-40 countries! But I share this with you, first, to encourage you to join me in learning about our global neighbors – and for praying for them – praying for the "healing of the nations." But I also share it with you so that you will hold me accountable to my challenge to learn something about a different country each and every day! Next up: Andora!!!!


