Our Summer Worship Theme: "Singing from the Heart'

hope that you have been enjoying our summer focus on some of the Psalms. We will be continuing this series through September 10! The Book of Psalms was the ancient "hymnal" of Israel, songs and prayers that reflect almost every human emotion - from joy to sorrow, from fear to anger from praise to lament. We fear to anger, from praise to lament. We hope that you will join us as we listen to the psalmist "sing from the heart" and allow the psalmist's words to connect with us and lead us in "singing from the heart" as well!

Call Process Update
The Church Council finalized and approved our Ministry Site Profile at its July meeting. The council also identified potential Call Committee members. Hopefully by the time you receive this newsletter, we will have our six Call Committee members in place. The next step will be receiving the names of potential Associate Pastor candidates from our synod office. We will be interviewing at least TWO candidates. If one of the two candidates seems to be a good fit for St. John's, the Call Committee will bring their name to the Church Council, and then to the Congregation for approval. A special congregational meeting will be called in accordance to our Constitution. Such a meeting will need to be announced at our worship services for two weeks prior, and in writing (either by mail or via electronic means) to the congregation at least 10 days in advance of the meeting. If neither candidate is a good fit for St. John's, or if they would happen to get another call, or if the congregation would vote not to extend a call to the recommended candidate, we will request additional names and begin the process again. Please keep this whole process again. Trease keep this whole process in your prayers as we move forward! Pray for the members of our Call Committee as they do their important work on our behalf, and, pray for the candidates as they also discern God's call in their own lives! Also pray that we as a congregation will begin to prepare ourselves to receive a new Associate Pastor into our midst!

Our third and final campfire/sing-a-long for this summer will be Tuesday, August 22 at 7pm. I hope that you will make every effort to join us for this time of fellowship and

The theme of the 2018 gathering is "This Changes Everything" based on Ephesians 2:8, "By grace you have been saved..." All youth who will be a part of the graduating classes of 2018-2022 are eligible to attend. There is still time to pre-register and join in what will be a once-in-a-lifetime experience.
