And finally we are grateful to Pastor Tom for stepping in and teaching the 5th and 6th grade D-Way class.

While we do have things covered for the time being — we need to realize that the above people are not "long term" solutions, but rather, are willing to step in and help for a period of time — and for that I am grateful!! I appreciate immensely their commitment to our CYF ministries, for their love of the youth, for the extra time they are giving, and for the exceptional gifts of leadership they each bring! I am also grateful for all those who serve as Sunday school teachers and helpers, D-Way guides, D-Way kitchen helpers ... we couldn't do what we do without you and your willingness to serve! I hope that others will be willing to step up and let it be known that you are willing to help out wherever there is a need — as substitute

Sunday school or D-Way guides, or with Wednesday meals. In short, we are in a time when we need "all hands on deck."

- ly \$453,000. To fund this budget, we need an average monthly income of \$37,750 (about \$8,725 per Sunday). We are now in positive ground again, after borrowing \$5,089 from other church funds. For 2016, we are still down \$15,602 for the year, starting the year with a surplus of \$20,400.
- 2. We still maintain a positive balance; our next mortgage payment will be \$9,587.00.


Pastor Dave will also be leading Sunday Worship at the Care Center on December 4th at 1:30pm.


