Financial Update

I first of all want to say thank you to all of you who caught up in your giving, gave a little extra, or signed up to be regular contributors via our Simply Giving or Online Giving options. It was good to end the month of May on such a strong note!!! I want you to know that I noticed, your leadership noticed!!!

But with that said, it's also important to remember that such an effort cannot be for just one month – but must become an ongoing habit so that through our giving we can continue to provide the faithful ministry that makes a difference in our own lives, in the life of our community, and throughout our country and around the world!

Again, I would like to encourage you to consider signing up for Simply Giving, or making use of our Online Giving options. Here are what some of your friends here at St. John's have said about these options:

"I was just saying to Jay this past Sunday how I am so glad we have decided to take advantage of the Simply Giving option. We do not have to feel any guilt if we are not able to make it to church on a Sunday to give our offerings. For families that are on-the-go on the weekends, this is a particularly great option! We feel good knowing that St. John's can count on that amount from us each month. It is easier for us and also makes it convenient for the church. I often think of Pastor Dave talking one Sunday about how the offerings we give to our church should be one of the first checks we write out each month instead of the church getting our 'leftovers' each month. That stuck with me. Now with Simply Giving that amount automatically comes out of my account on the 1st of each month, so I no longer feel like giving to our church is just 'the leftovers.' MAP Update

Having received the results of our recent MAP

assessment, we have had a couple of follow-up meetings to discuss what we have learned from the assessment, and how we might use that information to move forward. At our last meeting, the group decided that they would like to hold some "listening sessions" this coming fall (late September and early October) as a way of exploring and gaining greater clarity regarding our mission, and how we can grow our capacity to be a congregation where different opinions are welcomed. It is hoped that such "listening sessions" will be held in a variety of places – at the Church, in Member's Homes, Spilled Grain Brewhouse, etc. Led by trained facilitators, these "listening sessions" would be focused around some basic questions that would allow members and friends of St. John's the opportunity to share their opinions, to voice their ideas, and to offer their own insights within a supportive and listening environment. The MAP group also hopes that through this process, we can also provide all those who participate a clearer understanding of how decisions are made within our congregation, a clearer understanding of our current Mission Statement, and receive input on how we might "tweak" or "change" it so that it better captures our imaginations and brings clarity to what we believe God is calling us to do, and to be, together as a congregation.

This is all currently in the planning stage – but if you would be willing to participate in any way – (such as becoming one of the trained facilitators), please contact the Church Office. But above all, please keep this process in your prayers – for the goal is to bring greater clarity to the mission that we believe <u>God</u> has for us as a congregation as we move forward into God's preferred future.

SW MN Synod Assembly

We had a very good Synod Assembly. I am grateful for Sharon Hermanson and Diane Nelson for joining me as Voting Members from St. John's. A personal highlight for me was sharing an original song – which is the theme song of our synod's "Embracing God's Mission, Equipping God's People" funding initiative. Another highlight was being able to join the rest of the synod in honoring Pastor Tom and others who are celebrating the 50th Anniversary of their Ordinations! Other highlights, learning, etc. included:

- The Corporation of Lutheran Campus Ministry of Minnesota was dissolved. Synods in MN will now directly support those campus ministries that are within their synodical boundaries.
- River of Life Lutheran Church of Hutchinson was formally received as a congregation of the ELCA.
- Bishop Jon shared that since he began serving as our bishop (13 years ago) there has been a 41% decline in seminary enrollment. One-third of seminary graduates today have no seminary debt – thanks to financial support from their home congregations and/or

family. The other two-thirds graduate with an average educational debt load of \$43,000.

• For every dollar that is given via the offering here at St. John's – ten cents is shared EITHER with our synod and churchwide; or (for those who opted out after the 2009 vote) with our Matamba Mission and Lutheran World Relief. Of the 10 cents per dollar that is sent on to our SW MN Synod – about half of that stays within our synod and the other half is sent on to ELCA Churchwide. Together as the ELCA we began 62 new congregations in 2015; and have already begun 22 this year. We currently have 379 new ministries under development. We also are supporting 134 congregations that are in some stage of renewal. We provide support to 80 Companion Synods around the world. We have 73 Young Adults serving in Global Mission (11 of those are from our own synod). We together support 224 missionaries in 40 countries. Gifts from the ELCA's Fund for Leaders provided grants to 235 seminarians this past year.

- In addition to our regular Mission Support, 21.9 million dollars was given to the ELCA World Hunger program (our own synod last year donated \$1,035,000 towards World Hunger. A number of years ago congregations were challenged to give \$5.00 per member towards World Hunger. Beyond that, ELCA individuals and congregations also donated generously (I missed the total amount) to our ELCA Disaster Relief (our own synod donated over \$73,000 last year). We as the ELCA are known to be among the first to arrive, and the last to leave, after a disaster. In 2015 we were present in eight states and 23 countries. And in 2015 our ELCA met its goal of raising 15 million dollars to address Malaria. We focused our work in 14 countries in Africa. And while we met our goal, the work continues through our World Hunger Funds.
- This summer our ELCA will be meeting in Assembly in New Orleans (something that takes place now every THREE years). A couple of items that will be considered at this assembly: 1) adding to our current Ministry of Word and Sacrament, a rostered Ministry of Word and Service; and 2) a strategy for how we might accompany refugee minors. Our SW MN Synod unveiled a new three-year funding initiative entitled: "Embracing God's Mission. Equipping God's People". Our synod recently received a \$500,000 grant from the Lilly Foundation. \$250,000 of that grant are matching funds so the goal is for us to raise at least \$250,000 over the next three years. Already, at the assembly, "silent gifts" of almost \$90,000 have already been given or pledged by synod staff, synod council, and other various individuals and groups within our synod so we are off to a great start. There are THREE goals of this initiative that the money raised will be used to:

Deepen Congregational Vitality Enhance Local and Global Mission

Develop Servant Leaders

Included within this initiative is the building a Ministerial Excellence Fund that helps reduce burdensome educational debts of our future leaders. Do you know there was a time when the church PAID the tuition of all seminarians? This fund would also provide help when pastors meet difficult emergency medical expenses, and provided greater pension equity for those pastors who have served smaller congregations and who have not been paid adequate salaries.

Bishop Jon shared that this year we received 4 seminary graduates to serve within our synod (that is down from previous years), we currently have 23 from our synod that are in the Candidacy process; and this last year our synod birthed five new pastors and one Associate in Ministry (AIM). We continue to be a CONSUMER SYNOD when it comes to pastors! We need to call forth the gifts of God's people – and the best time to do that, to plant those seeds, is when kids are in 3rd to 5th grades.

Projection

Joe Bayer, in memory of Judy, has given a gift to cover the cost of new projectors for our sanctuary. These projectors have already been installed. The new projectors are laser projectors that produce 7000 lumens of light (3 to 4 times brighter than our old projectors). These new laser projectors are also maintenance free projectors (meaning no bulbs to change or filters to clean) and they should last us for 20,000 hours of use (approximately 20 years). We are SO GRATEFUL for this most generous gift! These projectors will not only provide greater clarity, but will enable us to be much more "creative". Again, we are SO GRATEFUL for this fitting memorial to Judy, who was an active member of our Tech Team.

Some Personal Anniversaries in July

July will mark some significant anniversaries in my life: I will not only begin the 35th year of ordained ministry (July 11), but I will also begin the 10th year serving as St. John's Lead Pastor (July 8th). I give thanks to God for BOTH of these milestones!!!!



- For May, 2016 the General Fund had \$7,179.48 more in income than expenses. May, 2016 was a good month, although it was a 5-Sunday month. Congregation approved budgeted expenditures for 2016 total approximately \$453,000. To fund this budget, we need an average \$37,750 in monthly income (about \$8,725 per Sunday).
- We still maintain a positive balance; our next mortgage payment in June will be \$9.587.00.
- 3. Precious Gifts Preschool balance is strong: \$5,916.23. Good position let's keep this up!


