

I hope that you will stop by and welcome her – introduce yourself – and let her know that we are so happy to have her as part of our St. John's community!!

<u>Pentecost</u>

Often referred to as the "Birthday of the Church" we will celebrate Pentecost Sunday on Sunday, June 4th. **Since the color of the day is RED - you are invited to wear something red that day - the brighter the better!!!**Together we will celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit --- God's presence with, within and among us --- who gathers us in Christ, and then scatters us to serve! Yes, it is the Holy Spirit who is daily calling us to faith, gifting us for service, empowering us for ministry in Christ's name, leading us into God's preferred future, and surprising us in countless ways with the wonder of God's love and grace!!! I hope that you will join us as we celebrate Pentecost Sunday on June 4th!

Our Summer Worship Theme: "Singing from the Heart"
Beginning on June 11th, we will be focusing each Sunday on one of the Psalms. The Book of Psalms was the ancient "hymnal" of Israel – and within the Book of Psalms there are songs/prayers that reflect almost every human emotion – from joy to sorrow, from fear to anger, from praise to lament. We hope that you will join us as we listen to the psalmist "sing from the heart" – and allow the psalmist's words to connect with us and lead us in "singing from the heart" as well!

Update on CYF Position

As of the writing of this letter, we have NOT received any applications for our Children, Youth and Family Director staff position. We understand that this may take some time – so we need to be patient; but I would also encourage you to share our need with anyone who you know who may be interested and qualified. We are open to a full-time person – but we are ALSO open to having people apply for a part-time position in a given age area (e.g. preschool/elementary; middle school; and high school). Please contact the church office with any

Suffering in our Midst

In May I attended a Continuing Education Event that focused on the painful reality of Domestic Abuse. Do you realize that a woman is beaten EVERY NINE SECONDS in the United States: or that 1 in 4 women are victims of Domestic Violence? In 2016, 60,000 women in Minnesota alone accessed services – but many more didn't out of fear that they would not be believed, because they lacked financial resources, because they lacked a support system, because their abuser had convinced them that it was "their fault", because they wanted to believe the abuser, the person they loved, that "it wouldn't happen again." But it does! It's a vicious cycle! That's the reality that we need to face as a nation! While there certainly are men who are abused by their wives/girlfriends – 90% of all abusers are male. And children are often victimized, if not directly, by being witnesses to what is happening within the home. Domestic abuse is all about power and control (it's not an anger management issues) – and it grows out of a fundamental lack of respect for women. As a nation, and especially as the Church, we need to stop tolerating the attitudes and beliefs that play into domestic violence (e.g. sexist comments and jokes). We can no longer afford to be silently complicit! We need to remember that abusers come in all shapes and sizes – many are "nice guys" out in the world – but not at home! Too many women are victims, too many are dying! We need to speak out...we need to let women know that God does NOT condone such violence...and when we sense something is wrong, when a woman comes us for help...we need to say: "I believe you, I will listen, I am here for you, I will support you, and you are NOT to blame!"

Update on Mt. Hermon Meeting

On Thursday, May 18th, Synod Minister Linda Pederson met with representatives from both St. John's and Mount Hermon to begin a discussion about we might more effectively work together as we move into God's future! It was an insightful meeting as we shared with each other what we believe are our "bright spots" or "assets" – and also what we believe are our "challenges." It's interesting, even though we are very different in size, we still have some of the same challenges. We will be meeting again on June 6th out at Mount Hermon (7pm) to continue the conversation – especially in terms of how we might work/serve
