
# SPEND AN "AFTERNOON OF CHRISTMAS JOY" WITH US —JANUARY 13

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Among notable 2018 deaths in the field of religion were those of:

- Germain Grisez: A lay married moral theologian who taught at Mount St. Mary's in Emmitsburg, MD for more than thirty years, he wrote an authoritative three-volume work that gave outstanding coverage to the field. He also worked alongside Oxford's John Finnis to present classic natural law teachings to the modern world.
- Rev. Billy Graham: Respected by millions for his preaching on the Gospel, he was once a top salesman for the Fuller Brush company. As an evangelist, he commented: "I'm selling the greatest product in the world. Why shouldn't it be promoted as well as soap?" For all his immense talent at communicating and his attractive presence, he kept the Gospel's message at the center of his enormously effective efforts, which reached an estimated 215 million people in 185 countries from many denominations and none. Few who heard him, including many Catholics, failed to be impressed with his sincere convictions and the crucial importance of his message.

#### Writers who died included:

- **V. S. Naipaul**: Famed novelist (especially for *A House for Mr. Biswas*) and essayist. Trinidadian by nationality and Indian by lineage and culture, he was a master of the English language and no favorite of feminists, as the eminent critic Clive James recalled:
  - He rousingly, and wittily, declared himself against the caste system, but in his later days he often proved that he was still an unreconstructed Brahmin: once, at his home in London, a workman wanted his help in opening a window, and Naipaul telephoned his wife at her place of work to tell her that he was being disturbed, and could she come home immediately because there was manual labor to be done.
- Neil Simon: Author of comedy plays (including "The Odd Couple," "The Sunshine Boys" and "Lost in Yonkers"), he once had four shows on Broadway at the same time.
- Donald Hall: U. S. Poet Laureate for 2006-2007, he wrote more than fifty books of poetry, drama, biography and memoirs. His blank verse often focused on his childhood, the deaths of his parents and grandparents, and his second wife, the poet Jane Kenyon.

- Tom Wolfe: Chief exponent of the New Journalism, his innovative use of language influenced a generation of writers. He was an acute observer of modern life styles and a deadly comical opponent of 1970s radicals, as can be seen in his essays "Radical Chic" (which mercilessly skewered the competition of wealthy New York socialites to host parties for radicals, especially one Leonard Bernstein held for the Black Panthers) and "Mau-Mauing the Flak Catchers" (on how a contingent of Samoans expertly intimidated federal housing officials).
- **Vladimir Voinovich**: Russia's greatest recent writer, a skilled satirist.
- Philip Roth: A Newark native and the author of more than thirty novels, including *Portnoy's Complaint, The Human Stain* and *Everyman*. Roth won every important literary award except the Nobel Prize.
- Stan Lee: Author of comic books, including on Spider-Man, The Avengers, The X-Men, The Incredible Hulk and The Fantastic Four. Without him The Walt Disney Company would not have come to dominate movie screens.

The world of politics and public affairs lost:

- Brendan Byrne: Former Democratic Governor of New Jersey, generally well liked even by his political opponents. For years, when adherents of rival political parties could still talk to each other civilly, he and ex-Governor Tom Kean, a Republican, jointly wrote a political column for the Newark Star-Ledger. When Byrne, whose public speaking style was characterized by mumbling, resumed the practice of law, his first client was the eloquent Tom Carvel, who successfully sued a Hackensack franchisee for not using company-provided ingredients.
- Parbara Bush: Greatly respected and fondly remembered wife of President George H. W. Bush. When she was announced as Wellesley College's graduation speaker along with Raisa Gorbachev, wife of USSR Premier Mikhail Gorbachev, protesters strongly objected. But, after bland comments by Mrs. Gorbachev, Mrs. Bush won the crowd over when she said, "Who knows, somewhere out in this audience may even be someone who will one day follow in my footsteps and preside over the White House as the President's spouse." Then, after a pause, she said, "And I wish him well," as the 5,000 people in attendance roared out their laughter. She continued:

As important as your obligations as a doctor, a lawyer or a business leader may be, your human connections with spouses, with children, with friends, are the most important investment you will ever make. At the end of your life, you will never regret not having passed one more test, nor winning one more verdict, or not closing one more deal. You will regret time not spent with a husband, a child, a friend or a parent.

- President George H. W. Bush: Lauded for his personal goodness even by his political foes (even if posthumously), as Vice-President he visited a boy hospitalized for leukemia in Krakow, and broke down in tears. (He and his wife had lost a young daughter to the same disease). Once, in his post-presidential years, he saw swastikas etched into the sand of a Hawaiian beach, then got hold of a rake and removed them himself.
- **Charles Krauthammer**: Winner of a Pulitzer Prize for journalism, he was a columnist for the Washington *Post* and a commentator for Fox News, despite suffering from a severe disability.
- **Richard Pipes**: After fleeing Communist Poland in 1946, he studied and taught at Harvard, wrote admired histories, and advised Senator Henry Jackson (an esteemed expert on foreign affairs) and Presidents Ford and Reagan on Cold War issues.
- **Vel Phillips**: Milwaukee's first African American councilman. She proposed an ordinance to forbid racial discrimination in housing in 1962, only to see it rejected by an 18-1 vote. She reintroduced it yearly until it finally passed in 1968. When a white man asked her, "What is it you people want?" she replied: "... My dear man, the same things you want: a place to live, green grass, a white picket fence, a place to go to work and good schools for our children."
- **Senator John McCain**: Former POW in Viet Nam's notorious "Hanoi Hilton," six-term U. S. Senator from Arizona, and 2008 Republican presidential nominee.
- John Martilla: Political strategist who left Richard Nixon after he could no longer believe in him and then worked for Democrats, including Senators Joe Biden and John Kerry; Rep. Robert Drinan, SJ; New York Mayor David Dinkins, Rep. Barney Frank and Massachusetts Senator Edward J. Markey, for whom he coined the slogan: "The bosses can tell me where to sit. No one can tell me where to stand."
