
















FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Four years after she became a Catholic, the Norwegian writer **Sigrid Undset** won the Nobel Prize for Literature, especially for her novels set in the middle ages, her

trilogy *Kristin Lavransdatter* and her four-volume work *The Master of Hestviken*. When her prize was announced and reporters showed up at her home, she called out to them: "I have not time to receive you. I am busy studying scholastic philosophy."

This Monday is the feast day of **St. Thomas Aquinas** (c. 1225-1274), by far the greatest of the scholastics, who is generally regarded as the most influential theologian our Church has produced. Greatly honored in his own time, he has continued to have an impact down to ours and has been rediscovered with special force at different times in Catholic history.



The great American author **Flannery O'Connor** was a keen reader of Thomas's foremost work, the *Summa Theologica*, from her young days. She once recalled, mimicking Thomas's style, that

I read it for about twenty minutes every night before I go to bed. If my mother were to come in during this process and say, "Turn off that light. It's late," I with lifted finger and broad bland beatific expression, would reply, "On the contrary, I answer that the light, being eternal and limitless, cannot be turned off. Shut your eyes," or some such thing.

The late novelist **Walker Percy**, another convert to Catholicism, was also much influenced by St. Thomas. Percy was in his medical residency training at New York's Bellevue Hospital when he contracted tuberculosis. He then spent an extended time at a sanatorium in the Adirondacks, where his agnosticism was challenged by conversations he had with a fellow patient, a Jersey City man named Arthur Fortugno, a well-informed defender of the Catholic religion. Seeking to refute him, Percy began reading one of the works Fortugno cited, St. Thomas's *Summa*, and wound up being much impressed with it. In Percy's masterful and hilarious—book Lost in the Cosmos, Aquinas is one of a group of leading figures of Western civilization who march into a live TV talk show (modeled on the one formerly hosted by Phil Donohue) to announce that, having had enough of human misdeeds, God would shortly be ending the world.

In appearance, St. Thomas was massive; in demeanor, a very quiet man. But what was he like in his central reality? Chiefly he was a person of charity. In his praised biography of Aquinas, **G. K. Chesterton** noted this was *(continued above)*

so from his childhood:

He had from the first that full and final test of truly orthodox Catholicity; the impetuous, impatient, intolerant passion for the poor; and even that readiness to be rather a nuisance to the rich, out of a hunger to feed the hungry

And Thomas had another beautiful childlike quality. Chesterton unforgettably described his last hour, after he became ill while journeying to advise the Church's Council of Lyons at the Pope's request:

But there must have been a moment, when men knew that the thunderous mill of thought had stopped suddenly; and that, after the shock of stillness that wheel would shake the world no more; that there was nothing now within that hollow house but a great hill of clay; and the confessor, who had been with him in the inner chamber, ran forth as if in fear, and whispered that his confession had been that of a child of five.

BISHOP JOHN M. SMITH

June 23, 1935—January 22, 2019
It is with deep sadness that we announce

the death of **Bishop John Mortimer Smith**, ninth bishop of Trenton and a key

member of the Team Ministry that led Saint Joseph Church starting in 1973.

Fr. Smith was ordained a priest of the Archdiocese of Newark on May 27, 1961. A graduate of The Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., he obtained a doctorate in Canon law in 1966. While serving in the Archdiocese of Newark, he held several positions, among them Assistant Chancellor, Tribunal official, parish priest, Director of the Cursillo Movement and Dean of Bergen County. In 1971, he was named a Monsignor by then-Pope St. Paul VI.

In 1973, Fr. Smith (he preferred that title to Monsignor) came to Saint Joseph Parish in Oradell/New Milford, along with Fr. Lewis Papera and Fr. Ronald Nicolosi, as one of the first members of an experimental "Team Ministry" in which three priests, rather than a single pastor, would share equal responsibility for the parish. In 1982, Msgr. Smith was sent to the North American College in Rome.

A Mass of Christian Burial was held at the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Assumption in Trenton on Saturday, January 26. Bishop Smith is survived by two brothers and many people from both dioceses who remember him with great fondness. Please watch this bulletin for some special remembrances of our own Fr. Many people don't realize that second and third trimester abortions are legal in New Jersey and routinely being carried out. The NJ Conference of Catholic Bishops has approved a postcard campaign designed to ask our NJ State Senators and Assembly Members to support legislation that would ban abortions after 20-weeks (5-months). The United States is one of only 7 countries in the world including China, North Korea and Vietnam that allow elective abortion past 20-weeks. blessing of throats after all Masses if you wish to receive a blessing.


WHO WAS ST. BLAISE?


