#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This is the Sunday for Super
Bowl LIII, which (longsuffering Jets fans don't have to

to SUPER BOWL

the Jets beat the Baltimore Colts in what was most likely the greatest upset in the history of pro football. Everyone who followed football then will recall the image of **Joe Namath** leaving the field with his upraised finger indicating that his team was now number one—a fulfillment of his famous guarantee that the Jets would win. But, of course, the victory was a shared effort of all the coaches and players. Here are two of them.

Johnny Sample was a defensive back for New York who had once been a Colt and who had played on two of their championship teams. His demeanor was beyond brash, and could even be regarded as offensive, especially to opponents. At one point in Super Bowl III, he intercepted an Earl Morrall pass to wide receiver Willie Richardson, and then tapped the football against Richardson's helmet, saying to him, "This is what you're looking for." (Today that would certainly have earned his team a fifteen-yard penalty for unsportsmanlike conduct.)

And then there was the Jets' formidable defensive captain, **Larry Grantham**, whose duties, in those days, included organizing defensive alignments, a function now carried out by coaches on the sidelines. Grantham was the lightest linebacker in all of pro football. His official weight was variously listed as 204 to 210 pounds but, as he once told an interviewer, it was actually lower. By the end of the season, he was usually down to 185.

After Grantham died in 2017, the great Newark Star-Ledger sports columnist Jerry Izenberg recalled what happened to him after the famous Super Bowl win. Grantham was so locally appreciated that he could no longer pay for a restaurant meal—or a drink. He abused the drinks so much that he became an all-star alcoholic. piling up DWI offenses, getting involved in a serious road accident, and finally winding up in a southern drunk tank. This led him to straighten out his life. From then on, he attended AA meetings several times a week, taught daily classes to other problem drinkers, gave fifty speeches a year without taking fees, and raised a great deal of money for Freedom House, a New Jersey alcohol rehabilitation facility. (When Grantham became ill with cancer and had to sell his Super Bowl ring to pay medical expenses, the people at Freedom House found out about it and led an effort to allow him to reacquire his ring, a deed that brought tears to his eyes.) So there's always






