

#### FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

The Church has four major mendicant orders, a name that implies that their members were to live in such material simplicity that, when necessary, they were

permitted to beg for their very sustenance. The original two, the Franciscans and the Dominicans, were later joined by the Hermits of St. Augustine and the Carmelites, and eventually by other smaller communities that adopted their ideals.

The first stirrings of religious life grew out of the practices of desert ascetics who lived the solitary life of hermits. The best known of these was **St. Anthony**, not the famous Anthony many call on to help them find misplaced items, but an austere and greatly respected holy man who lived in the Egyptian wilderness in the fourth century. In time, the number of hermits grew greatly, and those who inhabited a given area came to gather for common prayers, to be better nourished by sacramental life. And to share meals and other necessities in life. In time, through the efforts of such great figures as St. Benedict and St. Basil, this way of life developed into monasticism, as those who sought to devote themselves to God's ways lived together under the great Gospel values of poverty, chastity and obedience, guided by the "rules" of their particular congregation's traditional observance of them.

Before and throughout the Middle Ages in the West, the great monasteries did crucial work preserving the riches of classical civilization, the threatened heritage of the Roman Empire. Many also became politically and economically powerful, filling a vacuum left by secular rulers too weak to withstand the pressures of barbarians.

With the rise of larger towns and cities in Europe, many people who had once led stable but meager lives as dependents of feudal lords gravitated to these new centers of activity. But very often they did not find the gains they sought and found themselves in dreadful poverty, reduced to begging in order to survive.

It was in this context that the founders of the Dominican and Franciscan orders, **St. Dominic** (c. 1172-1221) and **St. Francis of Assisi** (1181-1226), did their illustrious work. Both were highly attuned to the needs of the poor and to the Gospel's insistence that Christians aid them. Francis famously exchanged his clothing for a beggar's ragged robe; and Dominic, even while still in his studies for the priesthood, displayed a similar spirit by selling his books and various other possessions to help needy people during a time of famine. (Asked once which books he most often read, Dominic said, "I have studied the book of charity more than any other, for it teaches us all things.")

Another important emphasis of the early Franciscans

and Dominicans was their zeal for bringing the Gospel message to the people they worked among. **Monika Hellwig** explained why they were well situated to do so:

From the beginnings in the twelfth century, the mendicant friars were distinguished ... from the older, monastic communities. Though they took vows and formed permanent communities, they did not follow a prescribed horarium (daily schedule) and were not bound to a particular place. They were intended to be itinerant preachers, able to follow apostolic needs wherever they arose.

Dominic was an avid participant in the preaching task, very notably in efforts to counteract the Albigensian heresy in southern France. He started an initiative called "The Holy Preaching," which eventually contributed great services to the universal Church and is why the formal name of the Dominicans is the Order of Preachers.

Another prominent characterist of the spiritual work of the Dominicans and Franciscans was their pastoral fervor for hearing Confessions, which the Pope gave them broad authorization to do. This fit in well with their preaching of the Gospel message, especially during the Church's great penitential season of Lent. As the liturgical scholar **Gerhard Podhradsky** has noted:

With the emergence of the mendicant orders ... there appeared the Lenten sermons with their predominant passion theme. These were often delivered daily and later ordered by the Council of Trent as "instruction of the faithful."

If this sounds a little like a parish Lenten mission, we are about to have one. Dominican **Father Jerome Cudden**, who is from our parish, will be preaching this Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. He will be focusing on people who had significant parts in the passion narratives. It promises to be instructive, interesting and inspiring. I hope you can be there. Father Jerome will be at all of this weekend's Masses to invite you to his presentations. **Msgr. David Hubba**

This year's **Lenten Penance Service** for both Saint Joseph and St. Peter the Apostle Parishes will be held on **Monday, April 8** at **7:30 pm** HERE at **Saint Joseph Church**. The clergy of both parishes will be available to hear confessions.

### LENTEN STATIONS OF THE CROSS -ON FRIDAYS

Saint Joseph Parish will pray the devotion known as "Stations of the Cross" each Friday during Lent in the upper church.
Stations will be held on the following Fridays—March 15, 22, 29; April 5 and 12 at 7:00 pm.

#### **2019 LENTEN REGULATIONS**

1. The days of **both Fast and Abstinence** during Lent are **Ash Wednesday** and **Good Friday**. The **other Fridays of Lent** are days of **Abstinence**.

On a day of **Fast**, only one (1) full meal is permitted, and two (2) smaller meals, which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.

On a day of **Abstinence**, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of Abstinence.

- 2. The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- 3. The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.
- 4. The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty\*) extends from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 8 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, June 16, 2019.**

\*Canon 920, §1. All the faithful, after they have been initiated into the Most Holy Eucharits, are bound by the obligation of receiving Communion at least once a year.




AT ST. PETER THE APOSTLE
