For the next two weeks, we welcome **Deacon George Montalvo**, Saint Joseph Director of Religious Education, who will be filling in for Monsignor Hubba while he is on vacation.

## FROM THE DEACON'S DESK

Summer is the time when we find ways to relax and to re-charge our bodies, minds and souls—to nourish them physically and spiritually. We need to renew ourselves to be ready again for family, work, school, etc.

Msgr. Hubba, in his "From the Pastor's Desk" column mentioned some books that will help us to nourish our souls during the last days of summer. In addition, I found a book in the church's rack: **Rediscover Catholicism: A Spiritual Guide to Living with Passion and Purpose**, by Matthew Kelly, published by Beacon Publishing and available from Dynamic Catholic.

Have you ever asked yourself: *Why am I a Catholic? What is the purpose of being Catholic?* I guess not many of us have done that. Many of us think of Catholicism as irrelevant and don't consider what an amazing gift we have—what is being offering to us not because we deserve it but because it a gift from God.

In *Rediscover Catholicism*, Matthew Kelly insists that Catholicism's fundamental principle is that God wants us to be happy and to be holy, to be "the best version-of-ourselves." In his book, Kelly recommends a number of spiritual exercises in the quest for holiness that involve the **Seven Pillars of Catholic Spirituality**:

1. Confession
2. Prayer
3. Participation in Sunday Mass
4. Daily Bible reading
5. Fasting
6. Daily Spiritual Reading
7. The Rosary

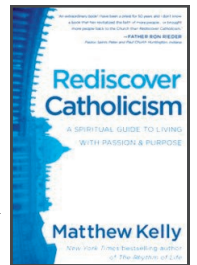
Kelly indicates that regular physical exercise is necessary to develop a healthy body, and that regular spiritual exercises are also necessary to develop "the best-version-of-oneself."

As baptized Christians, we are called to action. Education and evangelization should teach young people to celebrate "the best-version-of-themselves," to help them to participate in society, to find the work that is uniquely suited for them, and to engage their social responsibilities. Evangelization should be modeled after Jesus' style—nurturing friendships, prayer, and personal communion with the Lord.

According to author Kelly, it's all very simple. The key is discipline. Catholics need to get back to basics, keep the goal of holiness in mind, take inspiration from their Church's past achievements, study their heroes (the saints), and practice vigorously a holy life, so that they may become what God wants them to be.

Like any book this one it is not without weaknesses, but overall Matthew Kelly gives a very encouraging message to those who want to find an honest reason for being Catholic and also for those who continue to strive to grow in faith and holiness.

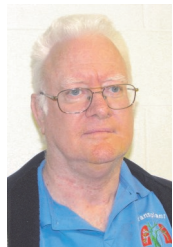

## A TRIBUTE TO JOHN BRERETON—"A MAN OF FAITH AND A FAITHFUL MAN"



Saint Joseph Parish mourns the passing of a very special man—a man who loved Saint Joseph Church and School, its parishioners and students, so much that he made their needs his life's work for more than twenty years.

**John Brereton**—retired U.S. Marine Corps captain, Saint Joseph Church sacristan for ten years, lector, altar server, proud Saint Joseph School graduate, SJS custodian for over nine years, generous school benefactor, Saint Joseph Athletic Association's biggest fan, a talented musician—went home to his eternal reward on July 5, 2015. We are certain that he was greeted in heaven with the words, "Well done, my good and faithful servant." (Matt. 12:21)

John, who was born in New York City in 1952, moved to Oradell, New Jersey, and enrolled in Saint Joseph School in 4th grade. He remained devoted to his alma mater, becoming one of its greatest supporters, quietly and anonymously donating needed items to help both students and teachers. **Roselle Fauria**, who supervised Saint Joseph School's After Care program for many years recalled that only days after John discovered that a VCR/DVD player was needed, a brand-new one appeared.

John was known to have had some good luck in a school raffle or two—*he is shown at right with a prize he won at one of the school's Tricky Trays*—but more often than not, his good fortune became a blessing for Saint Joseph School when he used his winnings to help his beloved SJS.



**Colette Vail**, principal of Saint Joseph School, worked closely with John for many years. "John will be dearly missed as one of the school's great supporters," she said, "not only as a hard worker, but as a believer in Catholic education."

John had a distinguished career in the U.S. Marine Corps, serving as a Data Systems Officer and retiring after twenty years as a Captain. The computer knowledge and skills he developed there became a tremendous asset to Saint Joseph School when he generously donated his services to bring SJS into the Information Age. "John brought to Saint Joseph the same spirit that marked him in his military service," said present pastor **Msgr. Hubba**, "doing whatever had to be done with generous sacrifice."

For the last ten years, John was Saint Joseph Church's sacristan. "As our sacristan," Msgr. Hubba said, "John was a familiar and welcoming presence for people who came here for Masses, weddings and funerals,

serving as a wonderfully warm ambassador for our church." Monsignor credits John with being indispensable in helping him to become acclimated to the role of pastor when he came here two years ago.

A 1969 classmate of John's at Saint Joseph Regional High School, **John Fuhrman** had eloquent words to describe his friend. "John Brereton was a good man, a patriot and a Catholic whose life had much value and meaning. He gave much, though he had little. He influenced many in positive ways. To me he was part of the soul of Saint Joseph's, a crucial element in making it the great place it has been and still is. He personified our high school's motto, *Vir Fidelis*—a faithful man."

John was a great sports fan and perhaps our Athletic Association's greatest booster. Over the years he kept score at our basketball games, at the SJS annual student/faculty volleyball game, and at swim meets at both the Oradell and New Milford Swim Clubs. He lent his booming baritone voice as announcer for both Riverdell and New Milford Junior Football games.

Speaking of John's gloriously rich voice, he used it to proclaim God's Word so beautifully at every Easter Vigil and each Sunday as a lector. And his talents extended even beyond that. He was an accomplished, mostly self-taught pianist. Saint Joseph Sacraments Coordinator, **Arlene Kennedy** remembered how generous John was with his talent—always willing to play for the annual Advent Reflection Service for seventh and eighth graders in the Religious Education program. He would conclude the service with a heart-stirring rendition of "O Holy Night."

Six years ago, John's health deteriorated and he became the recipient of a double lung transplant. "With all the medical crises he endured," Msgr. Hubba said, "John showed a different kind of bravery, but one that also flowed from the Marine values he prized. Without complaint, he accepted the amazing benefits of modern medical science and the attendant sacrifices they likewise required of him. And these measures allowed him to be with us for added years."

We at Saint Joseph are most grateful for those extra years with John. As parishioner **Jo Luby**, who worked for many years with John to set up the church for Mass on Saturday evenings, said, "What does one say of a man who not only proudly served his country but also his Church? John was fair, faithful, dependable and always available when needed, regardless of the hour. With all of his ailments, never once did John complain. We will miss him, and for all the good he did on this earth, a special place will most certainly be given to him in heaven."

John, may you rest in peace, dear friend.

Come and join us this Wednesday evening as we walk together on our journey of faith. If you're down and need a little lift, we're here for you.

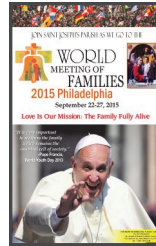

## ST. KATERI TEKAKWITHA

U.S. FEAST DAY: JULY 14

The daughter of an Algonquin mother and a Mohawk chief was born in 1656. When she was four years old her parents and brother died of smallpox. Kateri survived, but the disease left her scarred and her sight impaired. She was named "Tekakwitha," which means "she who bumps into things." Kateri's uncle took her in, and although she wanted to practice the religion of her mother, her uncle discouraged her. At the age of eighteen, Kateri began studying the Catholic religion in secret. After a time, her uncle gave his permission for her to become a Christian as long as she did not leave the village. There, she put up with ridicule because of her faith. In 1676, Kateri fled to Canada where she made her first Communion on Christmas, 1677. Although the last years of her life were difficult Kateri was known for her kindness and good humor. She died on April 17, 1680 and was canonized by Pope Benedict in 2012.

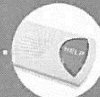

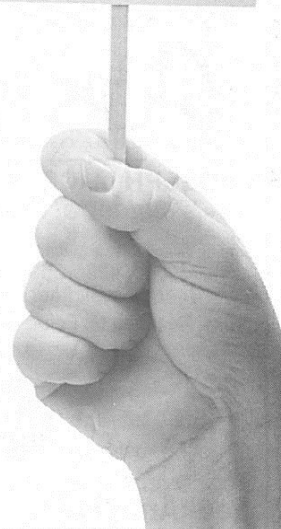
