



CHRIST THE KING

CORNERSTONE CHRISTMAS PARTY —DECEMBER 1





A PILGRIM'S SONG INSPIRATION FOR ADVENT AT SAINT JOSEPH CHURCH—DECEMBER 2

Richard Fritzky, brother of parishioner **Joan Murray** and author of the new book, *A Pilgrim's Song: Mary Varick and Her Theology of Suffering*, will make a special presentation to our parish community on **Wednesday evening**, **December 2** at **7:30 pm**. Rich will speak about the book, which features his remarkable aunt, and about his own personal experiences as well. He will help us to prepare for Christmas by focusing on a topic that has traditionally been thought of as a Lenten theme—"Carrying the Cross." He will suggest that affliction and suffering can become instruments of both joy and transformative grace, as well as a redemptive force.

Mary Varick and "God's Inner Circle"

In July of 1951, Rich's aunt, **Mary Varick**, who was an intimate friend of **Mother Teresa** of Calcutta, traveled to the shrine of Sainte-Anne-de-Beaupré, just north of Quebec City, with bone cancer and a prognosis of two months to live. She returned home, still disabled from a childhood bout with polio, but miraculously with no trace of the cancer.

Mary spent the next 37 years of her life dedicated to bringing others, especially the disabled (whom she called "God's inner circle") to joy, grace and God. She taught them what a privilege it was, through their own pain and suffering, to help carry the cross for Christ and to live the Stations of the Cross with Him.

A Gifted Inspirational Author and Speaker

Monsignor Paul Bochiccio of Immaculate Conception Church in Montclair,

had this to say about *A Pilgrim's Song* and its author. "It is incredible how Rich has captured the essence of his aunt's work to help bring meaning and joy to the lives of those who were largely forgotten by the rest of society. You can't read the book without taking stock of your own life and of the goodness and grace that you may yet have to share."

Fritzky's work chronicles his experiences with his aunt starting in his early teens—as one of her "Simons and Veronicas," the volunteers on her pilgrimages with the severely disabled. No stranger to affliction and suffering nor to the miraculous himself, Fritzky, now 65, is a survivor of Neisseria meningitis. The disease has left him a quadruple amputee and required more than 35 major surgeries. He has suffered end-stage renal cancer, a MRSA infection and multiple brushes with death. "What my aunt lived and preached, I also lived, as I too have learned to thrive where the suffering is."

A Life of Purpose and Profound Joy



Rich Fritzky has devoted his life to public service, community service, his students, his writing, and most especially, his family. Husband to Maggie, father of 12 and also grandfather of 12, with two degrees from Seton Hall University and a Doctorate in Humane Letters from Felician College—his background is both impressive and diverse.

He has been a special assistant to the mayor of Boston, the president of the Meadowlands Regional Chamber of Commerce, a member of the faculty of Fairleigh Dickinson University, a magazine editor, the New Jersey Commissioner of both Planning and Employment /Training, Chairman of a NJ Task Force on

Adult Literacy, a member of the Northeast-Midwest Leadership Council, a founder or co-founder of diverse non-profits including Meadowlink, New Jersey's first transportation management system. He has been a fierce supporter of the efforts of the Sisters of Saint Joseph of Peace to build the celebrated Kenmare Alternative High School for Unwed Mothers and Saint Joseph's Transitional Home in Jersey City.

Rich continues to teach online, to write and to speak. He does this to pay forward the great goodness that has been extended to him and to motivate and inspire others to give their last full measure to others as well, so as to live lives of fullness, purpose and profound joy.


