FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

To finish remembering some people who died in 2016:

From the world of **sports**:

- **Bobby Wanzer:** After starring as a guard for Seton Hall, he became a Hall of Fame player in the early years of the NBA for the Rochester Royals, now the Sacramento Kings. With his college teammates Bob Davies and Pep Saul, the Royals won the 1951 championship, although the league did not give them a trophy for financial reasons. A deadly shooter and skilled passer, he was an all-star five years in a row.
- Joe Garagiola: A St. Louis neighbor of Yogi Berra, he had a 9-year career with the Cardinals and the Cubs, and later became a beloved broadcaster with a great sense of humor and a fine collection of baseball stories. Describing his playing days, he said, "Not only was I not the best catcher in the Major Leagues, I wasn't even the best catcher on the street." He advised players to "Never trust a baserunner with a limp. Comes a base hit and you'll think he just got back from Lourdes." He claimed to know a player who wouldn't report the theft of his wife's credit cards because the thief spent less than she did.
- Clyde Lovellette: An early basketball big man at 6'9", he was the first player to win an NCAA championship (with Kansas, 1952), an Olympic Gold Medal (Helsinki, 1952) and an NBA title (with the Minneapolis Lakers in 1954 and with the Boston Celtics in 1963 and 1964)—a feat later matched by Bill Russell, Magic Johnson and Michael Jordan.
- Muhammed Ali: One of the greatest boxers—the greatest of all in his own judgment—he won Olympic Gold as Cassius Clay and then became world heavyweight champion several times, with famous wins over Sonny Liston, Joe Frazier and George Foreman. His refusal to serve in the Viet Nam War caused a major controversy. He converted to Islam, which he embraced with an ardent commitment. Besides his enormously attractive personality and humorous showmanship, he was a man of massive kindness and dignity, and became perhaps the most recognizable person in the world until Parkinson's Disease curtailed his public life. During a flight to Washington, he told writer Bob Greene:

Look at all those lights on all those houses....
Do you know I could walk up to any one of those houses, and knock on the door, and they would know me? It's a funny feeling to look down on the world and know that every person knows me. Sometimes I think about hitchhiking around the world, with no money, and just

knocking on a different door every time I needed a meal or a place to sleep. I could do it.

- Gordie Howe: A 23-time all-star, mostly with the Detroit Red Wings, "Mr. Hockey" had 975 goals—and 500 stitches on his face. He won 4 Stanley Cups and 6 MVP awards, and played his last game at age 52. A "Gordie Howe Hat Trick" was a goal, an assist and a fight. Bobby Orr called him "the greatest player ever."
- **Pat Summitt:** Her 1,098 wins are the most for any coach. She led her University of Tennessee women's basketball teams to 32 Southeast Conference championships, 18 NCAA Final Fours and 8 titles.
- Clarence ("Choo-Choo") Coleman: One of the favorite early Mets, he got his nickname from being a fast runner as a kid. (Manager Casey Stengel once said he never saw any catcher so fast at chasing down passed balls.) Choo-Choo could never remember names, even his teammates', and called everybody "Bub." Charlie Neal once said to him, "I bet you don't know my name," to which Coleman replied. "You're No. 4." Ralph Kiner, interviewing Coleman on his post-game show, asked him, "What's your wife's name and what's she like?" Choo-Choo said, "Her name is Mrs. Coleman and she likes me."
- Nate Thurmond: A 6"11" Hall of Fame center with the San Francisco and Golden State Warriors, he was renowned for his defensive play and was named one of the 50 greatest players of the NBA's first 50 years. Kareem Abdul Jabbar called him the toughest center he played against. He took down 42 rebounds in a 1965 game against Detroit and was the first player to record a quadruple double (in 1974, against the Atlanta Hawks, when he got 22 points, 14 rebounds, 13 assists and 12 blocks).
- Arnold Palmer: After serving in the Coast Guard for three years, he won 62 PGA titles, 7 of them major tournaments (including 4 Masters), and, with his winning personality, made golf a great TV sport. He was also a business success, with majority ownership of a Florida golf club and his own line of iced tea. His business manager, the late Mark McCormack, once joked that Arnie's epitaph should read, "Here lies Arnold Palmer. He went for the green."
- Ralph Branca: The Brooklyn Dodger pitcher who gave up Bobby Thompson's famous home run that won the 1951 National League pennant for the New York Giants. Although Branca was a fine pitcher (an all-star who once won 21 games), he was mostly remembered just for this. His daughter married the Mets' Bobby Valentine.

Deaths of popular **entertainers** included those of:

- **Richard Libertini:** In the original version of the hilarious comedy film "The In-Laws," he played the crazy Latin American dictator General Garcia, who owned a collection of paintings done on velvet backgrounds and got advice from a puppet character formed from his thumb and forefinger.
- **Abe Vigoda:** Most famous for his role as Tessio, a Corleone family *capo* executed for his treachery in "The Godfather" (1972), he also played Detective Phil Fish in the "Barney Miller" TV series. After *People* magazine mistakenly reported his death in 1982, he took out an ad in *Variety* in which he was pictured sitting up in a coffin reading the obituary.
- **Bob Elliott:** Half of the famous Bob and Ray comedy team (with the late Ray Goulding), which was greatly admired for its witty, offbeat radio humor. Bob, the one with the higher-pitched voice, was most known for his character Wally Ballou, ace reporter.
- George Kennedy: A supporting actor in many films, he won an Oscar for his role as the chain-gang convict Dragline, who became Paul Newman's main disciple in "Cool Hand Luke" (1967). He also appeared in "Airport" (1970) and in the thriller "The Eiger Sanction" (1975). He always remembered a conversation he had with Orson Welles, who told him that "Success is primarily luck anyway."
- Merle Haggard: A country music singer who wrote his own songs, he led a tough life before reaching stardom, growing up in a converted Santa Fe Railroad boxcar and later serving a prison sentence. He recorded 200 albums, had 38 number-one hits on the country charts, and, until recently, had a busy performing schedule. He died on his 79th birthday. His songs were sympathetic to those who had hard lives. In his obituary, Richard Turner described his best known hit, "Okie from Muskogee" (1969), as a "takedown of unpatriotic hippies." Eddie Dean, a writer on country music, called him "the last of the real country outlaws." Haggard once said that "Faith is the only way we're going to make it. None of us are smart enough to do it on our own."
- Julius La Rosa: Talented and handsome singer from Brooklyn who was fired on live TV by early variety show host Arthur Godfrey, who was not nearly as avuncular as his televised image. La Rosa later found work on TV, in clubs and in regional theater.
- William Schallert: He played the English teacher Mr. Pomfritt in the TV comedy series "Dobie Gillis" and the father in "The Patty Duke Show."

- Madeleine Lebeau: In the 1943 movie classic "Casablanca," she played the singer who leads the crowd in Humphrey Bogart's café in singing the French national anthem, which drowns out the Nazi officers' rendition of "Watch on the Rhine."
- **Ralph Stanley:** Southwestern Virginia icon of what he liked to call "old-time mountain music," which was featured in the 2000 film "O Brother, Where Art Thou?" He was raised on the *a cappella* music of the local Primitive Baptist Church. After being given an honorary doctorate in the 1970s, he liked to be called by the title. He was 89.
- Glenn Yarbrough: The main vocalist of the popular 1960s folk group The Limelighters. A restless spirit, he left the group to sing on his own and to start a school for underprivileged children. Besides going through four marriages and spending years at sea, he owned a Rolls Royce, a Bentley, a Porsche and two Ferraris, plus a house in New Zealand, a banana plantation in Jamaica and an apartment building in Beverly Hills, all of which he sold to support his school. He once said that "The only thing success has taught me is that success is meaningless."
- **Gene Wilder:** Star of many hit comedy films, including the superior original version of "The Producers" (1968), "Willy Wonka and the Chocolate Factory" (1971), "Young Frankenstein" and "Blazing Saddles" (both 1974).
- * Hugh O'Brian: Best known for the title role in TV's "The Life and Legend of Wyatt Earp" (1955-1961), he also appeared in the John Wayne film "The Shootist" (1976), playing a gambler—the last man the Duke killed on screen. Inspired y a 1958 visit to Dr. Albert Schweitzer's mission in Lambaréné, Gabon (then French Equatorial Africa), he founded "Hugh O'Brian Youth Leadership" (now called "HOBY"), to help teens become catalysts for positive change. It has had 300,000 participants, including former Arkansas governor Mike Huckabee.
 O'Brian's given name was Krampe. He took his stage name from his mother's side of the family, because it was "less vulnerable than Krampe to unfortunate misspellings."
- Oscar Brand: Folk singer whose radio program on the genre ran for 70 years, until last September, the longest for any show with the same host. He never took any pay for his program. Describing Brand's time on WNYC radio, Douglas Martin, in his obituary, noted that he "never had a contract, but he kept coming back. His employers particularly appreciated that he never asked for compensation—not did he ever receive any."

- **Florence Henderson:** After a successful Broadway career, she played the charmingly wholesome mom, on the TV comedy series "The Brady Bunch" (1969-1974, with later TV and film iterations).
- Zsa Zsa Gabor: A blond Hungarian bombshell who often appeared on TV, she was married 9 times and liked to describe herself as a good housekeeper, since every time she divorced a husband she kept the house. I remember seeing her, many years ago, on a late-night talk show, Johnny Carson's, I think. After her segment was over, she sat down as the next guest had his turn: the comedian Professor Irwin Corey (who did doubletalk and non-sequitur routines in a shabby cutaway coat and sneakers). When Zsa Zsa repeatedly and rudely interrupted him, Corey put her in her place, cutting her up into Hungarian goulash the way only a professional comedian can do. It was quite a performance. (I wonder if it's accessible on YouTube?) She was 99.
- Reynolds and Eddie Fisher, she was just 60 when she died from a heart attack. She starred in three of George Lucas's films: "Star Wars" (1977), "The Empire Strikes Back" and "Return of the Jedi." Her addictions, affairs and bipolar disorders figured prominently in her novel *Postcards from the Edge* (1987), which was later made into a movie. She also appeared in "Shampoo," "When Harry Met Sally," and "Hannah and Her Sisters," and was also a "script doctor," who was called in to fix films that needed it.
- Debbie Reynolds: An even bigger star than her daughter, she died of a stroke the day after Carrie died. She came into stardom in "Singin' in the Rain," dancing unforgettably with Gene Kelly and Donald O'Connor. After that, she starred in the 1952 film "Tammy and the Bachelor" (for which she sang the number-1 hit "Tammy") and its sequels. She was nominated for an Oscar for her role in "The Unsinkable Molly Brown" (1964). In his obituary for her, Erich Schwartzel wrote that she had "a paparazzi-feeding personal life," especially when her husband left her (and their two children) to marry Elizabeth Taylor, whose matron of honor Debbie had been for Liz's marriage to Mike Todd.
- William Christopher: A Methodist himself, he played the likable Catholic priest Father Francis Mulcahy, chaplain for the Korean War army field hospital in the popular sitcom "MASH" (1972-1983). He died of cancer, at age 84, on December 31.


