A MESSAGE FROM ARCHBISHOP MYERS

I write to you concerning an alarming and serious matter that negatively impacts the Church...The US Department of Health and Human Services recently announced that almost all employers, *including Catholic employers*, will be *forced* to offer their employees' health coverage that includes sterilization, abortioninducing drugs, and contraception. Almost all health insurers will be *forced* to include those "services" in the health policies they write. And almost all individuals will be *forced* to buy that coverage as a part of their policies.

In so ruling, the Administration has cast aside the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United States, denying to Catholics our Nation's first and most fundamental freedom, that of religious liberty.....We cannot-we will not-comply with this unjust law...And therefore, I would ask of you two things. First, as a community of faith we must commit ourselves to prayer and fasting that wisdom and justice may prevail, and religious liberty may be restored. Without God, we can do nothing; with God, nothing is impossible. Second, I would also recommend visiting (**www.usccb.org**/ **conscience**), to learn more about this severe assault on religious liberty, and how to contact Congress in support of legislation that would reverse the Administration's decision.

III. LIFELONG FAITH FORMATION – Growing as a Faith Community

A vibrant parish is committed to faith formation and religious education of its adults, youth and children. Catechesis, sacramental preparation, family formation, and the Catholic school are essential aspects of faith formation.

1. Provide education/formation for parishioners and parish staff to foster a deeper understanding of church and nurture the faith and spiritual growth of all age groups within the parish.

Invite/encourage parishioners to participate in faith formation programs. Encourage/facilitate small Christian community groups. Survey parishioners on topics of faith and spirituality they want to learn more about.

- Encourage and assist families to develop spirituality in the home.
 *Require parents to participate in the sacramental preparation programs. Develop materials that draw parents into their child's religious education. Research religious education resources/programs to assist families/parents.
- Encourage and assist all catechists to attain catechist training and certification.
 *Require catechetical certification of all catechists/Religion teachers. Provide catechists with teaching methods and class management. Hold periodic meetings for catechists to share ideas, concerns and effective practices. Provide a retreat experience for catechists.
